#### **World Conference of Secular Institutes**

I am writing this from Rome where I am now attending the annual executive meeting of the World Council of Secular Institutes. The executive is composed of twelve directors general, and our task is to study the situation of secular institutes throughout the world, and relations with the Roman congregations. Next Monday I meet with Archbishop Nesti, the secretary of the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life.

### **Central Council**

The central council met from February 4 to 6. Here are a few highlights of the meeting:

Guillermo Perez Montoya has been appointed assistant regional director for Colombia-Ecuador.

For several years now some young men from the Congo have been asking to join the Institute. One of them, Guillaume Mabilu, was sent to Haiti to continue his studies. He had been journeying in the Institute since the beginning of the 1990s. Jacques Harvey has been appointed to accompany the group. After the council met with Jacques, and following the positive recommendation of some of the Congo bishops, the council has accepted 15 candidates to aspirancy. Jacques Harvey has been named in charge of this foundation, and is their go-between with the central council.

*Pierre Hubert* of the Canadian District has resigned the editorship of *The Present Moment*. Raymonde and Fernand Turgeon have accepted the position.





As to the other documents found on that page, they are not secret but have to do with the inside life of the Institute. One must exercise discernment.

Another question has to do with birthdays. 
