The World Conference is composed of the directors of all secular institutes, and it will hold its quadrennial (every fourth year) congress in Mexico in November, 2008, and it shall study the most interesting ideas coming from the Symposium.

I want to explain to our lay people that the celebrate is a small card identifying its bearer as a priest. Though not often needed as proof of priestly identity, some priests have mentioned that they have had to show theirs, at one time or another.

#### Visit to Chile and Ecuador

In January I visited the confreres in Ecuador: a Canadian priest – Michel Charbonneau – works at the orphanage founded by Maurice Roy who died in 1998. There is a seminarian – Vicente Morrocho; two Haitian priests work in the diocese of Santo Domingo de los Colorados. And there is a diocesan seminarian at Guayaquil who is now ordained and wants to officially join the Institute.

I continued on to Chile where I attended the priestly ordination of Marcos Guerra. His parents Oscar and Carmen are associate members of the Institute. The Chile Region is growing: three priests, three seminarians, two celibate laymen, and fifteen couples. I returned to Canada quite enthused by what I experienced in Chile with the members there.

## **Canadian District Assembly**

The Canadian District will be holding its District Assembly May 18-21, 2007. The Assembly theme is *Living the Reality of the Present Moment... in Hope*. I invite all the Voluntas to join the Canadians in prayer, that the Father send His Spirit of truth, listening, sharing, and daring upon the Assembly delegates.

## **Secretary General and Director of Administrative Services**

Article 181 of our Constitutions stipulates that "The Secretary General is chosen by the Director General and his council from among the professed members who may or may not be members of the council. The Director of Administrative Services is chosen by the Director General and his council from among the professed members or committed members of the Institute who may or may not be members of the council." Article 182 states that they are appointed to a three-year term... renewable.

Leo Grégoire has accepted to continue on as secretary general. Since 1998 he has filled this position with professionalism. Leo is also secretary-treasurer of the Atlantic Bishops' Conference (the four eastern Canadian provinces).

Rénald Tremblay accepted in 2006 to complete the mandate of Paul-Alain Monpas, and has accepted a first three-year mandate. Rénald is the husband of Louisette Simard, and is a retired federal government employee. It was in 1999 that the Congregation for institutes of consecrated life accepted a modification proposed by our 1998 assembly general, that the director of administrative services be a committed associate member. Their mandate takes effect August 1 of this year and ends August 1, 2010.





## **Magnum Gaudium**

I recently received a letter from the Cardinal Prefect of the Congregation for Institutes of Apostolic life and Societies of Apostolic life, His Eminence Cardinal Franc Rodé, giving the director general a permanent indult to write dimissorial letters. Since the time our Constitutions were approved, in 1987, and the granting of pontifical right status, this issue had been pending. In 1998, the assembly general had voted in favour of making a request... which was done in 1999. We have now received a positive answer.

For members of the Institute, a dimissorial letter is a letter which the bishop or superior general of a community write to "call" a seminarian to ordination. It is a kind of election. Until now the director general of the Institute had to send the seminarian's complete file to Rome which issued an indult "ad casum," that is, authorising the director general to write a dimissorial letter on a "per case" basis.

During August I visited the members in New Brunswick, Canada, and a few members from Eastern Québec. During the visit I was accompanied by central councillor James Dunstan Selvaratnam.
