As an explanation to the lay people in the institute, let me say that the celebret is a small card identifying its bearer as a priest in good standing. The card is used whenever a priest is outside his diocese. Though it is not used very often, some priests have told me that they have used it at one time or another. It identifies the priest and allows him to celebrate the sacraments in places where he is not known.

## **Beatification**

On June 12 the beatification process of the Laotian Martyrs opened in Chartres, France. The Postulator is Father Roland Jacques, O.M.I., dean of the canon law faculty of St. Paul University in Ottawa (Canada). Among the martyrs was a young catechist, a probationer in the Institute, Luc Sy. He was born in 1938 and was killed in an ambush on March 7, 1970. Luc was a cousin of Bishop Louis Ling Mangkhanekhoun, of our Institute. A picture of the Laotian Martyrs and a prayer for their beatification will appear in the January 2009 issue of *The Present Moment*.
