WORLD CONFERENCE OF SECULAR INSTITUTES (WCSI)

At the end of November I attended the World Conference of Secular Institutes, in Guadalajara, Mexico, a meeting of all the directors of secular institutes throughout the world. It was also the occasion to elect the new executive. I served on the executive for two terms, 2000-2004 and 2004-2008. Ms. Claire Nantel, president/director general of the Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate (O.M.M.I.) was elected to the board. Congratulations to our sister.

Visitation of Members

In early January I shall be going to Cuba, and at the end of the month and all of February, I shall be in Asia for visitation of our houses in India, Sri Lanka, and Laos. This shall give me the opportunity to raise the India region as a district in formation.

There are therefore 15 ex officio members. This means that according to paragraph 3 of Article 138, there must also be 15 elected professed: "Regarding the number of Associate Member delegates, it shall be one third that of the professed delegates," therefore, 5 associate members and 15 professed. However, we know that the number will legally be greater because we have to proceed according to the proportion of members in a district. We shall therefore be more than 35 at the Assembly general. I shall publish the Institute's statistics of December 31, 2008 in the February edition of the *Central Council Newsletter*, along with the proportionate number per delegation.

Institute Statistics

Each year as usual, I must submit statistics to the Vatican Bureau of Statistics. As of December 31, there were 864 members in the Voluntas Dei Secular Institute. This is an increase of 23 members or 2.7% from last year, and is distributed as follows:

If you notice that the number of associate members does not always a equal a pair, this is because upon the death of one of the spouses, the other member of the couple maintains his / her rights and privileges (Constitutions, Art. 108, 3).

Those listed with the "Central" are the Director general, the members in Cuba (5), Laos (2), Ethiopia (13), Uganda (6), Ecuador (4), Italy (1), and Scotland (1).

Delegates to the 2010 Assembly General

As I mentioned last month, the assembly general is composed of 15 ex officio members; this means that the 15 delegates must be elected according to the percentage of members per district or region.

V.M.O. Director

Father works at raising funds to help young people in those poorer countries where the Institute is. 2010 Assembly General

You have received, in the February issue of the newsletter, the statistics of the Institute. Here, now, is the distribution of delegates for the next assembly general. Your district or regional director will look after the implementation.

In the Institute there are 308 professed members and 556 associate members, and we must go by percentage.

Breakdown of professed members:

Interpreting the chart: Canada has 69 professed members: This represents 22.4% of the total number of professed members in the Institute. We must elect 15 professed delegates: Canada has therefore the right of electing 22.4% of professed delegates, which is 3.3 members, therefore 3 members. And so on.

The members falling under CENTRAL are those whose numbers do not justify the creation of a region, or because the political situation of the country does not allow it: Cuba, Ecuador, Ethiopia, and Laos. There members maintain their right of electing, and elections will be held among them.

Canada has 89 Associate Members, which represents 16% of the total of Associates in the Institute. We must elect 5 delegates. Canada therefore elects 16% of the Associate Member delegates, which means 0.8%, which is rounded out to 1 member. And so on...

I point out that Article 138, paragraph 2 of the Constitutions states: "In each officially erected district or district-in-formation, professed delegates are elected by the professed members, and the associate member delegates are elected by the committed associate members." This principle holds especially for the regions.

A substitute must also be elected for the professed, and one for the associates. This is meant to fill in a delegate vacancy caused by illness, refusal of a Canadian visa, or other valid reason.

Patron Feast

On March 25, feast of the Annunciation, we celebrate the patronal feast of the Institute. It would be good that each district and region celebrate the day. Mary's YES challenges today especially those who belong to an Institute that bears the name VOLUNTAS DEI. This indicates that we must search for the Will of God in our personal lives.



April 2009

Assembly General

I suppose that in the next few weeks and months the district and regional directors will proceed with electing their delegates to our forthcoming 2010 assembly general. For the election procedure, please refer to Regulation 8.

At the last assembly general, certain specific qualities were mentioned, regarding delegates:

- a professed or committed member (Const., 138.2)
- having a deep attachment to the Institute and the Church
- a lover of the Institute who embodies its spirit and values
- knowledgeable of the aims of an assembly general, and accepting of them
- capacity for adaptation, objectivity, and team work
- capable of "thinking Institute"
- openness and sensitivity to the needs of the world

At the assembly we gather together to work at discerning what the Spirit expects from the Institute. The assembly is not a place for manipulating the conscience of others, nor is it a place for politicking.

India
