In the Footsteps of Jesus

The month of July marks two important events: the day of the foundation of the Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate and the Voluntas Dei Institute, a day consecrated to the commemoration of Our Founder (July 2), as well as the birthday of Father Parent (July 12). I have just finished reading his book « In the Footsteps of Jesus. » I find it interesting each time I read it. I am inspired by it to deepen my spiritual journey with our spirituality of the second five. I share with you my last reflection of this month.

There are three key words in the baptismal responsibility that are presented through three examples based upon the Gospel of John, 21:15-19, and that challenge me and my vocation. Priest vs to love Jesus; Shepherd vs to feed his sheep; and Prophet vs to follow Jesus.

As much in the common priesthood as in the ministerial priesthood, we have the experience of the love of Jesus who gave His life for us. He awaits from each one of us the same love. It is this love that unites all of us. Jesus is our first love. He is Love. He shows us how to live love. After having lived it in daily life, He poses the same question to us that He posed to Peter: « Do you love me? » « Do you love me more than those here? » What would I reply to Jesus? If I say yes, is there someone or something that moves me away from this love; do I have the qualities of love in my life (1 Cor. 13)?

The love of Jesus automatically orients toward an exemplary life. It allows a person to give meaning to his/her life through his/her actions. To be a shepherd is a leadership that attracts the attention of all the sheep. Jesus asks Peter to feed his sheep by being faithful to His love without fault. Father Parent presents it quite clearly in his book when he describes the being of service and peacemaker. Do I form myself in order to be a good shepherd with the true love toward Jesus by using the enriching spirituality of my beloved Founder?

It is only if we are rooted in the presence of God that we will be able to be prophetic in life, otherwise it will be very difficult. We are called to follow His experience and go forward. We must discern the signs of the times and interpret the Gospel in a positive manner with our lived life and prayer. The intimate relationship with God exhorts us to go forward without criticism and complaint. Father Parent wants all Voluntas to be prophetic in the midst of the world and to be witnesses challenging the secular realities.

Let's read, re-read and meditate again on « In the Footsteps of Jesus. » Let us allow ourselves to be inhabited by the ideas of Father Parent. Let us put firstly into practice the basic call of our baptismal vocation as members of the Voluntas Dei Institute.

Mission impossible

God chose Mary to be the mother of Jesus. She accepted the mission impossible of her maternity in the midst of the world. From the day of the Annunciation (Luke 1, 38) and until her Assumption, she humbly did the will of God and thereby assumed the risk of the reality of life. Her existence was filled with a multitude of challenges, and here are a number of them:

- Secret repudiation by Joseph «... an upright man, and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally... » (Matt. 1, 18-25)
- To give birth to the infant Saviour in a manger « ... there was no place for them in the inn » (Luke 2, 7)
- The prophecy of Simeon « ... a sword will pierce your own soul... » (Luke 2, 34-35)
- The disappearance and the response of Jesus to His mother « ... Why were you looking for me? » (Luke 2, 42-51)
- The wedding at Cana « Woman why turn to me? My hour has not come yet. » (John 2, 1-12)
- The ironic response of Jesus, « Who is my mother . . .? ...whoever does the will of God ... » (Matt 12, 46-50)
- The passion and death of Jesus (Matt. **26**, 1-27, 66), and most especially, Jesus giving of His mother to John « ... here is your son... here is your mother. » (John **19**, 25-27)

In spite of all of this, her mission was not ended. After the Pascal Mystery of Jesus, « All these joined in continuous prayer, together with several women, including Mary the mother of Jesus... » Acts 1, 14) Mary, trusting, knew how to convince the distressed apostles to receive the Holy Spirit.

Through her silent presence and acceptance, Mary became a model of the Will of God. In all situations of life. Holy Mary responded positively to God in the face of all impossible challenges and to a negative secular climate. She knew how to keep and accept at the depths of her heart all these affronts.

It is the call of a Voluntas ... « Voluntas Dei per Mariam Immaculatam »

Father Parent did not want to do the will of God, but be the will of God. Our very name « Voluntas Dei » is already for each of us an invitation to accomplish all that we can for the pleasure of God. To attach completely our actions to the will and pleasure of God is to to become holy, to work for the salvation of souls, to bring glory to the Lord and to be ourselves the praises of glory. The « Voluntas Dei » must be holy and rapidly. The Church asks us and we must be ready. (*L.M. Parent, omi*)

August is the month to recall the Assumption and the Coronation of the Mother of God, the destiny of God that He had chosen for her. Her whole impossible mission is the reason that must motivate us, challenge us in each moment of our life, working in the midst of the world in order to distinguish, recognize, perceive and discern the will of God in the midst of the reality of our society. Can we be the living witnesses of the will of God? Are we truly ready and committed to this mission impossible in the image of Mary?

Let us follow the example of the Virgin Mary in respect to her impossible mission in order to accept in our soul the will of God and become witnesses for those that we are called to mingle with!

Be not afraid

« Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you... » (Jer. 1, 5). What does this really mean today in a computerized and automated world centred on the « Me », tending toward isolation with the new technologies? On each page of our life, new sciences are created, leaving behind that which we have had trust in. Days pass by without us having a moment to ask ourselves what God awaits from us. We live in fear of this or that, lack of money, or not being competitive enough!

We run so fast after what we believe to be important that we forget to pay attention to His call and we lose sometimes trust « . . . the other personage says to me: « human that God loves, be not afraid! All goes well for you! Take courage, find your strength! » (Dn, 10,19). All changes so quickly!

God, Himself, does not change. He is Eternal. He knows us. He is always there for us and with us. He waits for us as a father does on a son or daughter so we should be listening for He has a plan for each one of us, « . . . I have graven you on the palms of my hands . . . « (Isaiah 49,16)

An important question has to be posed: Where am I going? Into the wind of the changing world or with God Eternal? God awaits the moment when we will be ready to listen to Him in order to follow the path and way that He has traced out for us.

« ... before you were born, I consecrated you . . . » (Jer 1, 5). Some obstacles can happen every day. In the face of such events, what does God expect from me?

Of course, collapse or grief in the face of adversity is normal and human. But what is the route that I want to follow afterwards? Who can help me to pursue my destiny? The Bible tells us, assures us and gives us confidence. Let's consult it often. It holds the words that we need to move forward. It is our strength and determination in order to pursue the goal to be achieved: « Rise, and have no fear . . . » (Mt 17, 7). A sign from God, a message, He supports me in my times of weakness; I am not alone, I am never alone.

Just as our Founder wrote us, Jesus came to do the will of His Father. The « Voluntas Dei » must accomplish the same will. « By myself, I cannot do anything, but with God I can do everything! »

Let us place ourselves in the hands of God in order to follow the pathway that He has marked out for us before even our birth.

Lynod of Bishops on the Family

The Extraordinary General Assembly of the Synod took place in Vatican from October 5 to 19, 2014. One of the participants of the Synod was Bishop Louis-Marie Ling, I.V.Dei. The theme of the Synod is "Pastoral challenges to the family in the context of evangelization". The Holy Father invites everyone to deepen the message of this extraordinary assembly in every local context by sharing the message to every family. I publish this message in my letter in order to study and discuss in the team meeting.

Official Message of the Synod

We, Synod Fathers, gathered in Rome together with Pope Francis in the Extraordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, greet all families of the different continents and in particular all who follow Christ, the Way, the Truth, and the Life. We admire and are grateful for the daily witness which you offer us and the world with your fidelity, faith, hope, and love.

Each of us, pastors of the Church, grew up in a family, and we come from a great variety of backgrounds and experiences. As priests and bishops we have lived alongside families who have spoken to us and shown us the saga of their joys and their difficulties.

The preparation for this synod assembly, beginning with the questionnaire sent to the Churches around the world, has given us the opportunity to listen to the experience of many families. Our dialogue during the Synod has been mutually enriching, helping us to look at the complex situations which face families today.

We offer you the words of Christ: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me" (*Rev* 3:20). On his journeys along the roads of the Holy Land, Jesus would enter village houses. He continues to pass even today along the streets of our cities. In your homes there are light and shadow. Challenges often present themselves and at times even great trials. The darkness can grow deep to the point of becoming a dense shadow when evil and sin work into the heart of the family.

We recognize the great challenge to remain faithful in conjugal love. Enfeebled faith and indifference to true values, individualism, impoverishment of relationships, and stress that excludes reflection leave their mark on family life. There are often crises in marriage, often confronted in haste and without the courage to have patience and reflect, to make sacrifices and to forgive one another. Failures give rise to new relationships, new couples, new civil unions, and new marriages, creating family situations which are complex and problematic, where the Christian choice is not obvious.

We think also of the burden imposed by life in the suffering that can arise with a child with special needs, with grave illness, in deterioration of old age, or in the death of a loved one. We admire the fidelity of so many families who endure these trials with courage, faith, and love. They see them not as a burden inflicted on them, but as something in which they themselves give, seeing the suffering Christ in the weakness of the flesh.

We recall the difficulties caused by economic systems, by the "the idolatry of money and the dictatorship of an impersonal economy lacking a truly human purpose" (*Evangelii gaudium* 55) which weakens the dignity of people. We remember unemployed parents who are powerless to provide basic needs for their families, and youth who see before them days of empty expectation, who are prey to drugs and crime.

We think of so many poor families, of those who cling to boats in order to reach a shore of survival, of refugees wandering without hope in the desert, of those persecuted because of their faith and the human and spiritual values which they hold. These are stricken by the brutality of war and oppression. We remember the women who suffer violence and exploitation, victims of human trafficking, children abused by those who ought to have protected them and fostered their development, and the members of so many families who have been degraded and burdened with difficulties. "The culture of prosperity deadens us.... all those lives stunted for lack of opportunity seem a mere spectacle; they fail to move us" (*Evangelii gaudium* 54). We call on governments and international organizations to promote the rights of the family for the common good.

Christ wanted his Church to be a house with doors always open to welcome everyone. We warmly thank our pastors, lay faithful, and communities who accompany couples and families and care for their wounds.

There is also the evening light behind the windowpanes in the houses of the cities, in modest residences of suburbs and villages, and even in mere shacks, which shines out brightly, warming bodies and souls. This light—the light of a wedding story—shines from the encounter between spouses: it is a gift, a grace expressed, as the *Book of Genesis* says (2:18), when the two are "face to face" as equal and mutual helpers. The love of man and woman teaches us that each needs the other in order to be truly self. Each remains different from the other that opens self and is revealed in the reciprocal gift. It is this that the bride of the *Song of Songs* sings in her canticle: "My beloved is mine and I am his... I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine" (*Song of Songs* 2:16; 6:3).

This authentic encounter begins with courtship, a time of waiting and preparation. It is realized in the sacrament where God sets his seal, his presence, and grace. This path also includes sexual relationship, tenderness, intimacy, and beauty capable of lasting longer than the vigor and freshness of youth. Such love, of its nature, strives to be forever to the point of laying down one's life for the beloved (cf *Jn* 15:13). In this light conjugal love, which is unique and indissoluble, endures despite many difficulties. It is one of the most beautiful of all miracles and the most common.

This love spreads through fertility and generativity, which involves not only the procreation of children but also the gift of divine life in baptism, their catechesis, and their education. It includes the capacity to offer life, affection, and values—an experience possible even for those who have not been able to bear children. Families who live this light-filled adventure become a sign for all, especially for young people.

This journey is sometimes a mountainous trek with hardships and falls. God is always there to accompany us. The family experiences his presence in affection and dialogue between husband and wife, parents and children, sisters and brothers. They embrace him in family prayer and listening to the Word of God—a small, daily oasis of the spirit. They discover him every day as they educate their children in the faith and in the beauty of a life lived according to the Gospel, a life of holiness. Grandparents also share in this task with great affection and dedication. The family is thus an authentic domestic Church that expands to become the family of families which is the ecclesial community. Christian spouses are called to become teachers of faith and of love for young couples as well.

Another expression of fraternal communion is charity, giving, nearness to those who are last, marginalized, poor, lonely, sick, strangers, and families in crisis, aware of the Lord's word, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (*Acts* 20:35). It is a gift of goods, of fellowship, of love and mercy, and also a witness to the truth, to light, and to the meaning of life.

The high point which sums up all the threads of communion with God and neighbor is the Sunday Eucharist when the family and the whole Church sits at table with the Lord. He gives himself to all of us, pilgrims through history towards the goal of the final encounter when "Christ is all and in all" (*Col* 3:11). In the first stage of our Synod itinerary, therefore, we have reflected on how to accompany those who have been divorced and remarried and on their participation in the sacraments.

We Synod Fathers ask you walk with us towards the next Synod. The presence of the family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph in their modest home hovers over you. United to the Family of Nazareth, we raise to the Father of all our petition for the families of the world:

Father, grant to all families the presence of strong and wise spouses who may be the source of a free and united family.

Father, grant that parents may have a home in which to live in peace with their families.

Father, grant that children may be a sign of trust and hope and that young people may have the courage to forge life-long, faithful commitments.

Father, grant to all that they may be able to earn bread with their hands, that they may enjoy serenity of spirit and that they may keep aflame the torch of faith even in periods of darkness.

Father, grant that we may all see flourish a Church that is ever more faithful and credible, a just and humane city, a world that loves truth, justice and mercy.

The Year of Consecrated Life

The year of « Consecrated Life » begins on November 30, 2014, the first Sunday of Advent and runs until February 2016, the World Day for « Consecrated Life. »

It has almost become a tradition that the Pope proclaims at the beginning of the new year a theme of reflection and meditation that will nourish our prayer each day. For 2015, Pope Francis proposes to us « the Consecrated Life » and he tells us why: that men and women of consecrated life will become better aware of the richness of their consecration to the Lord lived through the three vows of obedience, poverty and chastity. This imposes upon us to take the time to deepen this interior richness that carries a lot of hope and trust in God through a life of prayer, especially during this time of crisis that traverses our Church. People have a need to discover and sense the joy of our consecrated life through our attachment and fidelity to our commitments. It is a life that we have chosen. Thus, a gift of God and not a yoke that we carry. We must not forget this beautiful reality. And for the Church and for all of the members of the Church, consecrated life is a true gift from heaven and a precious witness of the Gospel rich in graces and gifts of all sorts.

The Catholic Church comprises a number of forms of consecrated life: religious communities or orders, contemplative communities or secular institutes; in other words, consecrated persons are called to live their commitments in a whole variety of ways. There is a great difference between the Trappists, Jesuits and members of Secular Institutes, and yet these groups are constituted by consecrated persons. All of the members are committed through their vows of obedience, poverty and chastity. The great difference is found in the way of living these vows: in a monastery, in parish ministry or preaching or in the midst of the world. What unites them is the gift of themselves to God in service to the Church.

This New Year that approaches gives us therefore the opportunity to say thank you to the Lord for the gift that he has given us in calling us to work in his service in the midst of the world. Not to acquire the values of the world but to witness to Jesus in today's world. People have a need to find again Jesus, the Saviour, in their daily life. There is so much to do and witness to! For us, our team life is a precious means of assuring our faithfulness to our vocation as Voluntas Dei and doing the will of God in the circumstances of our life.

The Church Continues to Call us ...

Pope Francis announced that 2015 will be a year dedicated to the promotion of consecrated life and he invites all consecrated persons to « reawaken our world » through our witness of a life of faith, holiness and hope.

In the journey of life, each consecrated person is as gift of God for His people. His people have a great need of each consecrated person's presence and for us, a beautiful opportunity to strengthen and renew our commitment to spreading the Gospel. Bri Lanka

We are in Holy Week and we will be entering into the Pascal Triduum. This is a time particular to all Christians who want to live the Pascal mystery of Jesus in order to allow themselves to be transformed into a new life. I wish each one of you an excellent Pascal time.

I have just returned from a visit to Sri Lanka where I had the opportunity to meet all of the members of our institute there. Today, I am going to share with you the situation of this district. Later, I have the intention of communicating to you my lived experience in the other districts and regions.

Father Parent came to Sri Lanka in January 1963. Results: he returned to Canada with three women and five men in view of forming them to become members of the institutes of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate and the Voluntas Dei. This was the beginning of secular institutes in Sri Lanka.

Since about 52 years, the Voluntas Dei Institute has been well established in Sri Lanka and comprises now 148 members (14 priests, 7 celibate laymen, 116 married members, 11 major seminarians, 11 minor seminarians and 7 persons spiritually affiliated.) We carry in our hearts the deceased members.

Sri Lanka possesses two houses of formation for the seminarians; one in Jaffna (North) for the minor seminarians and the other in Kandy (Centre) for students in philosophy and theology. The place founded by Father Parent in Muhamalai was in the war zone. At present, the government is in the process of mine clearing the land and it is very probable that the site may be returned to the Institute.

The Institute is present in 7 of the 12 dioceses. Being the only secular institute present in this country, our members are called to serve part-time in a number of parishes. What are our members doing? They are professors, spiritual directors, school teachers, formators, business people, hospital workers, employees of the government, accountants, farmers, fishermen, etc. The witnessing and secular consecration are truly attractive and a lively means for the new evangelization.

Throughout the war and since peace in 2009, they have been living the present moment.

Canada

The month of May is known for being traditionally the month dedicated to the Virgin Mary. The words of a song indicate that: « it is the month of Mary; it is the most beautiful month, to the cherished Virgin, sing a new song . . . » Father Parent cherished Mary. She was very close to him. At the request of the Superior General of the Oblates, he elaborated and founded the institute that he baptized « Voluntas Dei. » In his love for the Virgin, Father Parent based this foundation on the same attitudes of Mary of the Annunciation.

After having recruited about ten young men, Father Parent began the Voluntas Dei Institute with them. This was the beginning not only of the Institute but also the district of Canada. Canada saw the birth of numerous missionaries, priests and laymen, to help establish the Institute in Canada and elsewhere in the world. The Canadian members not only lived the charism and spirituality of the Institute among themselves, but they shared them throughout the world; today, the Institute is established in 22 countries. Consequently, Canada contributed greatly and in a worthwhile way in handing down its experience to members of other countries. A certain observation causes us to admit that in our day people are more and more secularized and industrialized and have neglected their religious beliefs. This state of affairs affects sufficiently the vocations and missions of the Church as well as the Institute.

The rate of the aging of the members of the district has become a reality more noticeable without taking into account the deceased; recruitment of vocations is very weak. In the face of this phenomenon, the energy of the district seems affected.

However, hope can arise from among the immigrants that have arrived in Canada bringing the richness of their faith. The multicultural and multilingual presence can be an asset for the Institute and the district if we are open to this dimension. The contribution of these new members could have the result of giving a second breath and diversity to the district of Canada. It is the hope of a new evangelization.

The District Assembly will take place this month having the theme of « Green Light: Let's Move Forward! » This was the same outlook that Father Parent had when he founded the Institute; the attitude of Mary of the Annunciation. « Nothing is impossible to God.» (Luke, 1:37)

I wish that this assembly, enlightened and guided by the Holy Spirit, gives vigor and strength to the district. May it be confident in the face of challenges raised and in its capacity to move forward into the deep.

Let us pray to the Lord and thank God for Father Parent and for all the members of the Canadian District in order that they may pursue with hope the same spirit, « **The Positive.** »

Dominican Republic

In October 1971, several Canadian missionaries of the Voluntas Dei Institute with Michel Laroche as their head arrived in the Dominican Republic to establish the Institute in this country. This was the beginning of a great presence for our Institute and it continues to this very day. At the start, there were six priests and a deacon who consecrated their life to the evangelization of the poor by helping the Bishops in this ministry. They pursued their missionary activities while at the same time recruiting vocations. The Institute recognized and appreciated the contributions of these pioneers from Canada. Today, the seed that they planted has grown and has become an impressive tree as Jesus says in : « Mt 13, 31-32 ».

Now the Dominican Republic has 20 priests, 3 married permanent deacons, 10 candidates to Orders and 217 committed members for a total of 250 members. There are two houses of formation for candidates to Orders; the house for the minor seminarians at Hato Mayor (Louis-Marie Parent) and the house for the major seminarians in Santo Domingo (El Buen Pastor). Eight minor seminarians and ten major seminarians are in the process of formation.

Evangelization is now pursued by the Voluntas Dei members coming from this country. They are unquestionably very devoted to the development of their district. Also, they are involved, each according to his/her capacities, to bring solutions to the problems of their country: poverty, prostitution, health, family, agriculture, etc. Team spirit and the particular qualities of the Voluntas Dei priests attract many Bishops to entrust to them parishes in their dioceses, very often those in development. They work in seven dioceses out of eleven in this country. The Altagracia District has signed contracts with each diocese where the priests minister. The Voluntas Dei priests come together every two months in a parish directed by the Institute.

The married couples of the Institute are in great number and play a major role in their city or village. They are an example for numerous couples who face certain difficulties: separations, divorces. These associated members give an example through their committed and spiritual life.

The District Altagracia will hold its District Assembly in the month of July of this year. I extend blessings and grace to all of the delgates to this assembly.

The members of the Voluntas Dei Institute of the Dominican Republic are true mutual supporters in making the mission « ad Intra ». They are witnesses of secular consecration through « **team life.** »
