The Voluntas Dei Institute was birthed in Chile in 1982 at Linares with the first team. In this country, our Institute owes its existence thanks to the generous support of our big sisters the Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate (O.M.M.I.). They greatly contributed to the development of our Institute in a number of mission countries. Especially in Chile, we must extend a particular thank you to Gabrielle Foucault who knew how to accompany the first steps of the members of this country.

The members of this first team knew how to sow the spirituality, life and the charism of the Institute in such a way that after 33 years of existence, this District in Formation today comprises 33 members: 4 priests, 5 candidates to Orders, 4 celibate laymen and 19 associate members. Even though the number of members may be slight, the quality of them is magnanimous. Indeed, their great involvement and commitments and what they bring to the local Church as members in the strict sense and as associate members is incredible. Our priests exercise their ministry in the churches of the different dioceses and also work in the universities and elsewhere where their help is requested.

The way of life of the Voluntas Dei, being particular and unique, seems to cause a certain loss of vocations in the spirit of those responsible for vocations of the different dioceses. Through good cordial, peaceful and reassuring relationships that our members have with the diocesan priests and consecrated persons of the various communities, this fear or difficulty has been become less marked. In this way, the members of Chile create an atmosphere of "Christian contact" in their own milieu where they live and work.

August 2015

India

Toward the end of the 60's, Father Parent, accompanied by Father Florentine Rajaratnam, visited India. They introduced the spirituality and charism of the Institute in the diocese of Trivandrum. Bishop Marc Netto demonstrated a great interest and expressed the desire to belong to the Institute. He and a number of diocesan priests constituted the first team which became a part of the District of Sri Lanka under the direction of Father Florentine.

In 1980, students were recruited by the Institute that erected a house of formation in Trivandrum, named « Bethel ». In 1988, India separated from Sri Lanka and became a distinct region. Vocations continued to grow more and more and a second house of formation was established by the Institute for major seminarians in Aluva.

Toward the end of the 80's, understanding the nature and involvement of laypeople in the Institute, the Archbishop of Trivandrum permitted the region of India to integrate married couples as committed members.

It has always been a great challenge in India to express secular consecration in the milieu on account of the cultural barrier, religious consecration specifically and the participation of laypeople. However, India is one of the promising districts for vocations today. In a short period of time, it comprises:

31 priests incardinated in the Institute

2 priests incardinated in a diocese

32 candidates to the priesthood

50 committed members

For a total of 115 members.

India has members in two states of the country: Kerala and Tamil Nadhu. Now its mission is to extend to Assam (north east of the country). Further, a new mission is in construction in Australia comprised of five priests.

It is a great challenge for the members of the Voluntas Dei Institute in India to form their members both initially and on-going in order to be evangelizers of secular consecration within the context of multi-culturalism, multi-religious and involving a number of rites. In their daily life, the put into practice the complexity of « becoming leaven in the dough, salt of the earth and light of the world » in a pluralistic society.

Let's thank God for the blessings of vocations and also let us pray for the realization of the very essence of **Secular Consecration.**

Colombia

Colombia is a country of South America that is called « the ground of vocations to consecrated life » where we are present. In 1978, Guillermo Pérez, a priest of the Institute, working in Canada at that time came to know and live the Voluntas Dei spirituality. At the time of the return of Father Guillermo to his country, the Institute, desiring to have an entry door to this continent, took advantage of the opportunity to promote the Institute in Colombia. It then asked Pierre Marois, a Canadian priest, desiring to become a missionary, to connect with Guillermo to establish the Institute there with this opening onto all of South America. The Bishop of Pereira welcomed them and gave them permission to found the Institute in 1979. Pierre created a team at Pereira and Guillermo created another one in Armenia.

As the number of members grew, not only in Colombia, but also in neighbouring countries, the Central Council decided to erect the District of South America in 1989. Pierre Marois was appointed the director of the district and he remained there until 1999 when he left Colombia to return to Canada. Guillermo Pérez became then the director of the District of South America. In 2002, the district was dissolved to form two (2) regions: the region of Colombia with Ecuador and the region of Chile. Jaime Alberto Henao Arroyave, a priest of the Institute, became the director of the region of Colombia until 2004. Another readjustment occurred in 2004 making the members of Ecuador dependent upon the Central Administration.

With an open attitude, the members of Colombia agreed that a celibate layman assume the post of director of the region; Alonzo de Jesús Posada Echeverry filled this position until 2011. Since 2011, Guillermo Pérez has been the director.

The members of the Institute come from different regions such as Quindío (Arménia), Antioquia (Medellín) and Tolima (Purification). At the beginning of 2015, the Institute comprised:

- 2 priests incardinated in the Institute
- 4 celibate laymen
- 3 candidates to the priesthood
- 7 committed members

For a total of 16 members, and also 2 spiritually affiliated persons.

The Colombia sector tries hard to integrate and consolidate the members in the spirit and objectives of the Institute. And, even if the villages are far from each other, the members have created an atmosphere of peace and fraternity not only in the midst of the members of the Institute but also with our big sisters, the Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate (o.m.m.i), who are also present in Colombia.

Let us pray together that in this country and elsewhere where the Institute is erected, the attitude of « **Peace and Fraternity in Jesus Christ** » gives rise to more people becoming members and also the flourishing of vocations.

Haiti

It was in 1964 that the Voluntas Dei Institute made its entry into Haiti with the arrival of Father Parent who had been approached by Father Rodrigue Auguste. It was mutually agreed that Father Parent would bring a number of major seminarians to Canada to give them Voluntas Dei formation. In May 1965, four seminarians made their entry into the seminary at Red Rapids, New Brunswick, Canada for their initial formation. They were ordained as priests in June 1966. The Institute began in Haiti with native priests of this country.

Moreover, Father Claude Lacaille began the project of a minor seminary in 1966 and welcomed 20 students that he initiated into the spirituality of the Institute at Maison de Bolosse, Port-au-Prince.

The first Haitian priests and a number of Canadian missionaries participated ardently in parish activities and evangelization in the different dioceses such as Port-au-Prince, Les Cayes, Jérémi and Jacmel. In this era, they had sometimes to cover miles on horse or donkey, and they accomplished magnificent missionary work. At the time of the second visit of Father Parent in 1981, married couples were introduced to the spirituality of the Institute. Six couples from the dioceses of Jérémi and Port-au-Prince began their journey with our Institute.

With time, young seminarians recruited received their formation at Bolosse and were ordained priests. They joined their colleagues and participated in the development of the Institute in their country. Numerous vocations and the witness of the life of the members continue to light up this district in spite of the growth of economic and political difficulties and poverty that are often the lot of daily existence in this country.

In different parishes where they work, our members are appreciated and attract young people to the spirituality of the 5-5-5 and to priestly life. They contribute to showing the light of Jesus Christ through their devoted and attentive presence to the Haitian people. In addition, not only are the members of this district missionaries «ad intra», but they have added missionary teams "ad extra"; that is why they are now doing their work of evangelization in Haïti, France, Dominican Republic, the United States and Guadeloupe. The number of members does not cease to grow, and as of December 31, 2014, the district comprised:

25 priests incardinated in the Institute 6 priests incardinated in a diocese 3 lay members

11 major seminarians 34 committed persons for a total of 79 members.

Haïti is a district officially erected. This country faces a lot of challenges. The growth in Voluntas Dei members is constant; each commitment is very deep and real. It is a great challenge today for these members of our Institute to keep their identity while maintaining unity in diversity. This unity must be maintained with each member in Haiti in order to develop **the Voluntas Dei spirit of team life.**

Let us give thanks to God for the witnessing given by our members in Haiti and let us pray for the realization of unity in the midst of diversity.

In 1977, the Voluntas Dei Institute extended its roots into Cuba with the generosity of our big sisters, the Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate, already present in this region and Father Yvan Bergeron, p.m.e., who desired to give birth to it in this country.

At the very beginning, thanks to the spirituality of the 5-5-5 and secular consecration, three celibate laymen and a a number of married couples showed their interest in the Institute and became members. In that era, it was very delicate and problematic to practice consecrated life in this country. Cuba began under the responsibility of the Central Administration and became a region on May 1, 2014.

Father Louis-Marie Parent, Marcel Forest and Michel Laroche played a crucial role in the beginnings of the Institute in Cuba. Thank you to the Apostolic Nuncio, the Cardinal of Havana, the Archbishop of Santiago and the Bishop of Matanzas who worked diligently in order to have the Institute rooted in their land.

In spite of numerous challenges present in Cuba, the members manifested a great serenity and a great spirit of faith: the majority persevered in their vocation, but a number withdrew. With determination and passion, Nestor Fornaris pursued his journey and not without a lot of sacrifices incurred during a long period of time. Finally, on February 9, 1993, he was ordained a priest by Cardinal Jaime Ortega, Archbishop of Havana, with the participation of the Director General, Yvon Carpentier. Throughout many years, he remained alone and lived the spirituality of the Voluntas Dei Institute in a discreet manner. Then, Juan Carlos Borrero Simon was recruited and pursued his theological studies in Chile where he was ordained and then returned to Cuba to serve as a Voluntas Dei with Nestor Fornaris.

In time, another member was recruited; Eduardo Enrique Fonseca Ponce, doctor, also attracted by the charism and the spirituality of the Voluntas Dei Institute; he is doing his priestly formation in Havana, Cuba. Other celibate laymen and couples have been recruited. At the end of 2014, the statistics were:

- 2 priests
- 2 celibate laymen
- 1 candidate to the priesthood
- 2 married couples

for a total of 9 members.

In order to favour the development and the recruitment of Voluntas Dei members in this country with the recommendations of the Apostolic Nuncio and the Bishops, Cuba is now a region. Our members in Cuba are the salt of the earth, the light of the world and the leaven in the dough, witnessing to the charism and the spirituality of the Institute.

I am convinced with the recent visit of Pope Francis as well as the new relationship established with the government that the young Cuban Voluntas Dei shoot will become a magnificent mango tree whose fruits will be known to bring life to everyone.

I ask you to keep them in your prayers.

In the first years of its foundation, the Voluntas Dei Institute attracted a good number of persons. The first member from the United States was Leo Grégoire in 1960; he joined the Canadian District.

Later, Thomas Furlong, Michael Craig and several other laymen joined the Institute and, slowly they formed teams under the jurisdiction of the Canadian District. Through their enthusiasm, spirit of joy, openness and a great freedom of expression of their faith, the growth in the United States has progressed very rapidly through the openness of spirit and lay spirituality. In August 1998, the United States was canonically erected as a region. George Hazler became the first American director.

By reason of the growth in members and the vitality of teams and sectors, the United States became financially self-sufficient. On account of their continued development, the United States region was erected as a District in Formation on August 5, 2006.

Coming up to the expectations of the reality and deep nature of the Voluntas Dei spirituality in the spirit of our Founder, the United States was canonically erected a District on March 1, 2013.

Spreading the charism and the spirituality of the Institute, the United States District accepted members from various countries such as Trinidad, Tobago, Japan, Germany and England. At the invitation of the Central House, the United States District accepted the responsibility of guiding the members in Ethiopia; Ethiopia is now a sector of the United States.

The District is well organized; it has put into place different committees such as the committee of formation, committee of vocations, committee of missions, committee of finances and finally the committee of liturgy. An annual congress is preceded by a retreat of a couple of days in length not forgetting the sector meetings in March and November as well as the team meetings each month.

As of December 31, 2014, the United States District comprised:

20 priests incardinated in the Institute 19 priests incardinated in a diocese 2 deacons 17 celibate laymen 65 committed members For a total of 123 members and 15 spiritually affiliated persons.

I wish to thank all members and especially those in charge. In order to live the spirit of Father Parent, I want to say to each member, God has created each person and a number of abundant hearths where people recharge their batteries, get the fire and connect with other hearths and I pray that you may continue all with the spirit of « **Being Voluntas Dei.** »

I have spoken to you in January about three important factors that direct our lives as Voluntas Dei. (Const. #1) Father Parent invites us to surrender ourselves completely like Blessed Virgin at the Annunciation to God in order to draw everyone to God by words and deeds of his/her exemplary life. He adds as well that a Voluntas Dei must have the quality of humility to live obedience, the simplicity to live poverty and the fidelity to live chastity in daily life beginning with self in his/her immediate family and going on in all circumstances to place it in relationship with one's fellow beings.

The Holy Father

The Voluntas Dei Institute is a secular institute of pontifical right since April 3, 1987. The Holy Father is the first director general. Not only for Voluntas Dei members, but also for all of the orders of consecrated life that are under pontifical jurisdiction; they are called to obey his authority. There is about three thousand congregations and 1.5 million consecrated men and women in the universal Church today in order to participate in the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ with the local Church..

February 2, 2016 was the day concluding the year of consecrated life. Representatives of many religious institutes, institutes of apostolic life and secular institutes etc. who participate in consecrated life came together at the Vatican for five days to reflect upon and deepen their commitments in union with the Holy Father. There was a great deal of joy, love, sharing, happiness and planning for the future. Finally, a public audience with the Holy Father who addressed them by mentioning clearly important choices for deepening the commitments to the new evangelization. He insisted on employing a different method for extending the hand to all of creation with humility for holiness.

« There is no humility and there is no holiness without passing through humiliations; there is no humility without humiliations. And if you are not capable of supporting a humiliation in your life, you are not humble. Thus, the objective of holiness that God offers to His children, to the Church, goes through the humiliation of His Son whom He allowed to be insulted, to be placed on the cross unjustly. And this Son of God Who humiliated Himself is the way to holiness: through your attitude, you prophesy the humiliation of Jesus. »

During my visit to Rome, I had the privilege of a private audience with the Holy Father after the Mass at Santa Martha. I spoke to him about the Institute, its charism, spirituality, our founder, our members and our presence in different countries. As is his habit, Pope Francis addressed himself to me in complete simplicity and humility. At a given moment in the course of our conversation, I felt like I was with members of my family or with my best friends. This personal encounter with the Holy Father made me challenge my own simplicity and humility.

In closing, I asked him to bless all of the people that I held in my heart and all of the Voluntas Dei members. Before the blessing, he asked me to pray for him and he also requested that I tell

all of the Voluntas Dei members to pray for him. Afterwards, he blessed me as the representative and Director of the Institute. Then he asked that I transmit the blessing that he had given to each and everyone of you.

Let's be faithful to the Holy Father who is the head of the universal Church as well as the head of our Institute. Now, I send to each of you the blessing that he gave.

Openness to the Holy Spirit

In this beautiful month of May, month of Mary, month of the feast of Pentecost, month in which we are going to mark the departure of Father Parent for heaven, I invite you to reflect on openness to the Holy Spirit. I will do it from certain aspects of the life our Blessed Mother, the Virgin Mary, from the life of our good Father Parent, and from our own mission in the world as members of a secular institute.

At the beginning, though all was unformed and diffused, *the Spirit of God* hovered over the waters to start the great adventure of creation (Genesis 1:2), thanks to *Father-Creator*, Who is the explicit instigator and through His *Word* pronounced, that John, the evangelist, considers as being Jesus Himself (John 1). *The three in one God* were already together in a proactive way to create a unique world, a world made at their image.

Thus, the pronounced Word brought about what it said: «Let there be light . . . and there was light! (Genesis 1:3) » This creative voice of the Father is identified with the Saviour Son, fulfillment of the Father, Who, when the time came, was incarnated in the world that He Himself had created for « all things were made through Him, and without Him was not anything made that was made. » (John 1:1).

The incarnated Son will want to live in fulfillment as a human the experience of the Holy Spirit more specifically, on three occasions: from His conception (Annunciation), at His baptism and at the Transfiguration. After His resurrection, He will announce and wish peace upon the Apostles. In breathing upon them, He says to them: « Receive the Holy Spirit » (John 20:22). They themselves will be awakened more concretely to the life in the Holy Spirit at the time of Pentecost and will transmit to us, to this very day, the awareness of this life in the Holy Spirit.

Our Blessed Mother, the Virgin Mary also lived, in the shadow of her Son, this complete openness to the Holy Spirit. Even throughout the challenges that she lived, certainly questioning, however, she knew how to open herself to the Spirit of the living God, to allow herself to be enlightened and transformed in order to continue her journey without putting up barriers to the divine plan. A big thank you for her openness to the Holy Spirit! This allowed her to discern the will of God and accomplish it (Annunciation). From that moment on, she was open to the Spirit and helped others to receive this same Spirit. For example, with her discreet and very effective accompaniment, she guides the Apostles to open them to Pentecost. Mary is Mother of the Church. She is our Mother and she knows how to guide us to live the experience of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

Our Father Parent was open to the Holy Spirit throughout his life. For example, when he was a child, when he was at the seminary, and when he was sick. In all circumstances of his life, he maintained openness to the Holy Spirit. We know all that he lived until the venerable age of 98 thanks to his openness to the Holy Spirit, for God wanted him to give more.

Thanks to openness to the Spirit, Father Parent gave three foundations to the Church: prayer is indispensable as support to all human work (**Recluses**). Then, he will discern that grace is in all of the baptized throughout the world where Christ has His rights (**Oblate Missionaries of Mary Immaculate** and **Voluntas Dei**).

Openness to the Holy Spirit for Father Parent was always declined as follows: first, for all believers through the Word of God; then, for all consecrated persons, through the way of the Constitutions, then for all through the signs of the time, that is *through each person*, *each event* and *each experience*, good or bad, that we live or encounter in the present moment.

As Voluntas Dei, we are called to live this openness to the Holy Spirit through our diversity. On the one hand, we are involved in varied missions and through our different statuses as priests, celibate laymen or married couples, and all of this according to our talents, and respective abilities. On the other hand, we are called to work together *in unity* through our cultural and ethnic differences! However, wasn't this the same challenge that the first Christian communities during the apostolic times lived, at the time of Pentecost, people of diverse languages and cultures invited through the voice of the Apostles to constitute *in unity a one and same assembly* of believers?

It is in this spirit that I invite you to live our 11th AG in July through an attitude of openness to the Holy Spirit that creates unity where there is diversity. Through our differences, may we allow Him to work at the interior of ourselves to better understand the Word of God, to better live according to the Constitutions and that we might better discern the signs of the times through each person, event and experience that we are living in the present moment.

I invite all to live profoundly the very beautiful feast of Pentecost. Let us pray with our Blessed Mother, the Virgin Mary, in the Cenacle of her heart, and with Father Parent who has entered into heaven. May we be rooted in the presence of God as Voluntas Dei.

Dear Friends,

As we are entering into the month that precedes directly our Assembly General, I feel that it is appropriate to reflect together on Secular Consecration in its aspect *presence of God*. Father Parent always said that we could become saints while being completely in the world, that is to say, to be at the same time in the world and *in the presence of God*.

As you can observe, I am speaking about the theme of the 2016 AG: *presence of God*. On reflecting upon this theme and what Father Parent said, I have been also touched by the Gospel of John:

« I have said this to you that in me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world. »

God wants us to maintain peace no matter the challenges or the problems encountered for He has overcome all of them. How to arrive there? By walking *in His presence*, eyes fixed on Him, or as the Bible states « by walking before the face of the Lord » (*lifne Adonai*) as Abraham was invited to do (Gn 17:1), day and night in the calm as well as in the storm.

This walking in faith makes the challenge not only less heavy to support but like John the Apostle says, it produces endurance and patience that allows even « to consider with joy » all of the obstacles to surmount (James 1:2-4), and in this way, we might become perfect.

To lean on God alone, to recognize Him in everything and to trust Him with all one's heart, is this not the best way for Him to make straight our paths? (Proverbs 3:5-6)

Our trust and our abandonment into His hands allow God to act in our lives. By walking in His presence, we give Him permission to transform us and to lift us up to Himself.

« We know that in everything God works for good with those who love Him, who are called according to His purpose » (Rm 8, 28).

All of this takes a life-time to learn and to integrate. In the realm of a secular consecrated life, this integration is rendered possible, among other things, through initial and on-going formation.

At the age of 8 or 9, my father brought me to a pool to learn how to swim. At the beginning, he placed his hands under my body to keep me in the position of floating. Then, bit by bit and to the degree that I felt confidence and that I could maintain my balance, he withdrew one hand and then the other while remaining close to me in case I would need his help. I continued to try this experience and each time he went further away from me while keeping an attentive regard on me. One day, while keeping a certain distance from me, he told me that it was my time to swim toward him which I did asking: « Why does he leave me to manage this on my own? » However, as he trusted me, as he was my « daddy » and he was near to me, I gained self-assurance.

Is it not the same in our relationship with God, our Father, our «daddy» in the midst of initial and on-going formation? The pool is the world in which we live. The water represents the dangers and the challenges to overcome. God is our «daddy» who calls us: His hands support us at first in a palpable way in order to help us to remain in spiritual balance without which we could not swim in the water of life; this is *initial formation*.

Then, little by little, He allows us gradually to gather our own momentum while completely remaining close to us and having confidence in us. In this way, our trust in Him can grow. Then, He draws away from us a little bit and asks us «to swim» on our own: this is *on-going formation*. He is always there, ready to intervene and He always trusts us even if it happens again that we fear drowning.

God knows this world in which we live and He has overcome it; there is no reason to be afraid. In this way, He dares to place us there since all that we might live there He has already overcome in advance. That is why, He invites us ardently to remain in peace even through the turbulences of this world; He is always there, close to us, our good «daddy» ready to intervene.

We, Voluntas Dei, are in the world and we are called to experience the presence of God there through challenges and difficulties. It is important to note that without initial and on-going formation, it will be difficult for us to experience God in the world. When we happen to do it, this is our way of «swimming» through this world while avoiding drowning. When I have confidence that my «daddy» is there to help me, I feel at peace no matter what.

The 2016 AG must teach us how to maintain balance in this water that is the world and how to «swim» toward our «daddy» in peace of heart and spirit. In this way, will we not arrive at the holiness that Father Parent spoke so often about?
