Assembly General of CMIS (WCSI)

From August 21-25, I was very happy to participate in the Assembly General of the World Conference of Secular Institutes in Rome. We were close to 140 participants coming from 25 countries representing close to 32,000 members of some 200 secular institutes. We had the honour of welcoming Cardinal Joao Braz of Aviz, the Prefect of the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life who presided the opening Mass on August 22nd. We were also gratified by our meeting with the Holy Father during his general audience of Wednesday.

I would like to share with you three important aspects that came out of this Assembly. Firstly, the theme of our *identity*. Who are we as members of secular institutes? Are we aware and convinced of our identity? If so, it will be better expressed in words and in acts, and thus, be shown tangibly and better transmitted around us.

In the second aspect, we underscored *formation* : CMIS (WCSI) commits itself to implementing a general formation for all of the secular institutes with the common base being the traits of consecrated secularity. This general formation, put forward by the CMIS, will be brought to the awareness of the Magisterium of the Church in order for it to take into account the specificity of secular institutes in the framework of consecrated life in general. Also, these common traits can help each secular institute who will be able thereafter to add to it its specific formation, charism and distinctive colour. Finally, each individual will be able also to bring to it his/her own personal charism, all being synchronized in harmony.

Finally, the Assembly brought out *the importance of working together with the authorities of the local Church.* The members of secular institutes do not walk in parallel with local Churches; they must involve themselves, play a role and take part in the activities of these Churches where they are implanted. Moreover, the local Churches will come to understand and incorporate to their mission the specific role of Secular Institutes members.

The Pope summarized well what he expects of the members of secular institutes : « <u>daily</u> <u>discernment</u> that allows the finding of a balance between being at the same time fully lay

and fully consecrated, and, in this way, *« finding God in everything. »* He insisted also on the importance of <u>formation and fraternal life</u>, even without imposed community life, that must help to create unity between *« action and contemplation. »*

Finally, he reminded us of the importance of <u>interpreting the «signs of the times »</u> by allowing ourselves to be guided by God while accepting the « *complexity and the precariousness of our times* » : this is the mission of consecrated lay persons who while bearing in their daily life the vows of chastity, poverty and obedience, must form an « *advance wing of the Church in the new evangelization.* » (Vatican News)

I end by saying to you my great joy in sharing with you such a message of hope while hoping that it will also bear fruit in your lives.

Formation of Candidates to the Priesthood

Greetings to all in Jesus and Mary,

As you know already (i.e. letter of September) I made a presentation concerning the Voluntas Dei Institute in Rome this past August. In order to allow you not only to know what I said but also to remind you about the major points of the formation that we give to future priests and members of our Institute, I thought I would share with you a summary of my words.

After indicating that our Institute is composed of priests, consecrated celibate laymen, committed married couples and persons spiritually affiliated, I presented the stages of formation to the priesthood that we offer.

For the formation of future priests, our Institute firstly follows the Decree on priestly formation *«Optatam Totius»*. Then, in order to attain the specific objectives of our secular Institute, our major Seminary includes studies in philosophy and theology, and especially formation in the midst of the world. This corresponds also to a text from St. Paul in the letter to the Hebrews (5 :1) where he indicates clearly that *«* every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God . . . *»* This involves that men intervene with persons in the world.

In this way, formation carried out in the Institute will bear upon these aspects in link with this perspective. It is therefore important to integrate well the following 3 points when a young man presents himself to you to become a priest among us :

- 1. Is the candidate called to ministerial priesthood ?
- 2. Is he called to secular consecration ?
- 3. Is he called to serve in the Voluntas Dei Institute ?

I wish to remind you that general formation to the priesthood within the Voluntas Dei is contained in the following 6 points :

- a) To give a **human formation** that involves knowledge of self and maturity as well as an openness to others and an intimate relationship with God.
- b) **Spiritual formation** that is ongoing and allows for the deepening of the grace of Baptism and the capacity to live according to the spirituality of the 5-5-5 in complete conformity to the will of God.
- c) When thinking about **intellectual, pastoral and missionary formation,** it is important to allow the candidates to receive indispensable formation in philosophy and theology and in all other pertinent domains. In the Institute we aim at formation in pastoral attitudes that comprise among others

welcoming and dialogue. At the missionary level, each must understand what is the mission of the Church and that of the Institute which involves going wherever Christ has His rights.

- d) A particular aspect of our formation is to be **able to read the signs of the time.** This means that a priest must continually bring about his own « up to date » according to the era and the society in which he lives always keeping in mind the Gospel and the Constitutions.
- e) Coming close to the end of this list, the following point is very important. The candidate to the priesthood must **be an agent or instrument of the Holy Spirit** and must let Him be expressed through oneself. Our priests are agents of the Institute in the sense that they express the spirit of the Institute. They are **first of all Voluntas** Dei then, as such, they are priests serving the Church with the Voluntas Dei colour. Obviously, they are also agents of the Christian community.
- f) Finally, our Institute insists on formation to secular consecration for each priest will work in the world that surrounds him. He will be inserted in the midst of the world but without belonging to the world (Perfectae Caritatis no. 10) and will attempt to gather together and unify the various persons and cultures and build peace in Jesus Christ.

As you know, and with the objective that each one understands well the mentality of the Voluntas Dei Institute, all diocesan and all religious priests who wish to join the Institute must follow the same procedures and the same formations as that of aspirants to the priesthood.

The above is a summary of my small presentation which gave rise to a number of questions to which I was pleased to respond.

Attitudes for Approaching Prayer

The month of November begins with All Saints Day when we celebrate the saints and is followed by a day dedicated to the deceased. This logical sequence reminds me that we are all united through our faith in Jesus, the Christ. Further, we, *the Militant Church* in pilgrimage on earth, receive the prayers of the *Triumphant Church* (the saints and angels) and have the duty to pray for the *Suffering Church* (the deceased).

This task encourages me again to share with you the importance of our prayers and their effects upon our daily lives. I read somewhere that in order for a prayer to bear fruit, four elements are required to receive the grace of God and to be productive.

Firstly, we must try to be perfect like our heavenly Father is. This is not an easy task, but at least we must be aware of it and journey in this direction — as Father Parent said, we are called to be perfect here on earth.

Secondly, if someone is aware of the essence of holiness, he/she will be open to love each person just as Jesus did. Humanly speaking, we have the tendency to love others in a subjective rather than in an objective way. If someone wants to obtain a positive response to prayers, it is very important that it's not a possessive or self-centred prayer, but must come from that person's loving experience taken from his/her daily life.

Thirdly, when we have an attitude of availability to serve others, we must be capable of valuing them and looking positively upon all. When someone prays, God sees how he or she perceives the others, sometimes better than the person him/herself does it. He lifts up this praying person on account of his/her availability to serve others.

The last point and certainly not the least, what is important to pray well is our humble awareness and acceptance of our human frailties. This humility will exalt the one praying and will give to him/her peace, joy and glory.

In this way, dear friends, in developing the four above-mentioned elements, we will remain united in prayer within the *Militant* Church in union with the *Triumphant Church*, and ask God for his clemency for the *Suffering Church*.

Beatification of Luc Sy, IVDei

My dear sisters and brothers Voluntas Dei,

It is a great great honor for me to announce you the beatification of the first Voluntas Dei, **Luc Sy** IVDei, a married member from Laos who was a missionary catechist in the region of Vientiane, capital of Laos. He was a probationer in our Institute along with Bishop Louis-Marie Ling, then deacon, and he undertook missionary work in an area where priests were prevented from evangelizing. Consequently, he went there to evangelize as a layman.

Luc Sy was born in 1938, and baptized in 1951. He entered the Voluntas Dei Institute in 1965 as an aspirant, and became probationer the year after, in 1966. In January 1970, the Bishop of Vientiane officially commissioned him as missionary catechist, in the region of Vientiane, in the mountains where many villages of refugees were found. These were considered "hot zones" where he generously visited the sick, gave communion, shared his own goods, and prepared children for baptism. He was known for his helpful attitude and his unconditional love for everyone; he made no distinction between Christians and non Christians. Luc really added to the development of the Christian faith in this area. Both, Louis-Marie Ling IVDei and Luc Sy IVDei regularly renewed their faith through monthly retreats and lived by the spirituality of Voluntas Dei; in this, they became witnesses by their lives in the midst of several risky challenges against their faith.

On the eve of March 7, 1970, Sunday of *Laetare*, Luc, along with two other companions were ambushed as they were on their way to visit catechumen friends in Dene Dine. Louis Marie Ling IVDei survived the ambush, but Luc Sy as well as his other companion, Phô Inpèng, were martyred later on. Louis-Marie Ling testified of Luc Sy this way: "The day we spent together, on the eve of his death, he prayed all day long, from morning till evening without interruption. In the evening, when I saw him, he told me: 'Now, I'm ready.""

From that day, **Luc Sy** is being honored for his sanctity and martyrdom. He was and he is remaining as a living example for other catechists. Khamu Christians revere his memory still today.

Working in Laos as missionaries, evangelizing the people in a communist context was not an easy task. There were several priests both religious and diocesan, along with lay people, who had to give their lives as martyrs for evangelization. Now, the Universal Church has recognized 17 martyrs who gave their lives in a significant way for Christ, from 1954 to 1970, and has proclaimed them as "Martyrs of Laos". The official celebration of the beatification of these 17 martyrs will be held in Vientiane, Laos, on **December 11th, 2016**.

Let us be united in prayer with our "first blessed Voluntas Dei", *blessed Luc Sy*, and ask ourselves how much dedicated we are to our own commitment as Voluntas Dei members and as Christians in general. Let us ask him, also, to intercede for us, in order that we may obtain the courage and the necessary wisdom to face the present day challenges of our secular reality, some of which may become hindrances to our own Christian way of life today.

May God bless us all, and help us to be authentic missionaries.

Reflection on Peace

Dear Friends,

Firstly, at this time I wish to extend to you my sincerest wishes of peace and joy at the beginning of this New Year.

Also, it seemed to me appropriate to begin this new year by sharing with you a reflection on peace. To do this, I wish to be inspired simultaneously by our spirituality, by the Gospel and by the message of Pope Francis marking the 50th World Day of Peace.

First of all, peace is a gift that our Saviour and Lord Jesus Christ gives us when he says only a few hours before His death : «Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid,» (Jn 14, 27). How does one interpret this? In the face of all situations of distress or anguish, God is there and He does not forget us. He simply asks us to open ourselves to His gift of peace in the needed moment. «The peace of Christ becomes mine when I accept it as a divine gift, a supernatural gift, » Father Parent tells us.

Peace begins within oneself; if I welcome the peace of God within myself, I will be at peace with myself and at peace with others. Firstly, it is important to work on oneself, on one's own interiority. « For from within, out of the heart of ... [the person]... come evil thoughts »(Mk 7, 21). Thus, if I am well disposed interiorly in recognizing the grace that dwells within my brother and sister, I will be open to dialogue with them. On the other hand, if I harbor in my heart jealousy or ill will, or let negative criticism or complaint take hold of me, it will be difficult for me to establish a relationship of peace and trust with this person.

In this way, peace can emerge when each person knows how to recognize in the other, whoever he/she is, a sacred being, a gift of God, a person who merits dignity and respect. This attitude, which is firstly rooted in contemplation and prayer, is at the basis of all exercise of non-violence of which Pope Francis speaks about, and this, even if the person has been a victim of violence: «When they know how to resist the temptation of vengeance, the victims of violence can be the most credible protagonists for non-violence and building of peace,» (Pope Francis, *Message of January 1, 2017*).

In complete humility, in the face of God, to know how to acknowledge the other in his/her grandeur, even the poorest; this means not falling into the trap of the superiority complex, an attitude that comes too quickly, unfortunately unbalancing the harmony in relationships.

It is certainly a question of humility and truth, but also one of justice. Peace can only occur in totality when the steps to achieve it are in concert with justice for all people involved. There cannot be true peace without the sincere and honest attempt at justice and equality for all. To break down the walls of *apartheid* by considering the other as equal is the inescapable point of departure for peace to be realized.

Finally, peace cannot be realized without unconditional forgiveness. In all conflicts, there are wounds on one part or the other. Reconciliation is not always possible on account of the limits of the human condition. However, forgiveness, in the spiritual realm, is rendered possible through the grace that we receive from Jesus Christ when on the cross he said : « Forgive them Father for they know not what they do, » (Lk 23, 24). This is the grace to be requested in order to receive true peace. However, God through Jesus Christ can also heal our wounds through the forgiveness that we agree to give in His name, and in faith. As Father Parent says: «The human being builds him/herself more through forgiveness than through hatred or grief.» This is to what we are called; this is what I wish for you and I as Voluntas Dei members during 2017, to be builders of peace in the manner of Jesus Christ.

Evangelical Counsels

As you know, on February 2^{nd} , the universal Church celebrates the Presentation of Jesus in the temple (Luke 2:22ff). By fulfilling the requirement of the Jewish law (Exodus 13 :2, 11-13), the couple, Mary and Joseph, presented their first born to be consecrated to God. Thus, this ritual of consecration is an opportunity for the Son to *to offer Himself to the Father* for his human mission— « Here I am Lord, I come to do your will » (Psalm 39) ; *He offers Himself also to the world* for the salvation of all as it is said in the letter to the Hebrews : Christ « had to be made like His brethren in every respect, so that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make expiation for the sins of the people » (Hebrews 2 :17).

The Church takes advantage of this feast day to celebrate Consecrated Life. Thus, February 2nd will mark the XXI World Day of Consecrated Life. On this occasion, I invite each and every one of you to remember again how your vocation sprouted as a Voluntas Dei. To remember a gift received is in some way to update its grace for today.

Obedience – Usually in religious life institutes, the three vows are presented in this order: poverty, chastity and obedience. Father Parent proposed to present obedience firstly since, from this latter vow, arises the dynamism for the two other vows. Indeed, obedience enlightened by the *Word of God*, the *Constitutions, the signs of the time* and by *the authorities* can do nothing else but guarantee vows of poverty and chastity that are aligned with the very life of Christ. By means of these four media, we can be better inspired by the Holy Spirit in order to discern the will of God in our daily life and thus reiterate with joy our *fiat* with Mary.

Poverty – It is important for each and every one of us, single or married person, to pursue the objective of *sharing* our riches as recommended in the Scriptures: «He who has two coats, let him share with him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise (Luke 3 :11).»

Father Parent presents sharing in this way: your talents are gifts that God offers you. You share them with the Institute, the Church and the world. You are a gift of God for the Institute and the Institute is a gift of God for you, for the good of the Church. We also share the same spirituality of the 5-5-5. It is a spiritual wealth that we cannot keep for ourselves. Thanks to the first 5, we achieve spiritual exercises that open our hearts to the concrete attitudes of life that are stipulated in the second 5. Finally, these attitudes launch us automatically into the accomplishment of acts of charity and kindness according to the third 5; the latter express both our spirit of poverty and our concern for sharing. In this way, when the time comes to give monetarily, Father Parent gives us a concrete way of doing it: set aside a little money each day according to one's means. It's little to give at the moment, but at the end of the year it represents a reasonable share.

Chastity – For Father Parent, chastity is above all a question of faithfulness, whether it is for a person engaged in consecrated celibacy or for a married couple. The person who lives consecrated celibacy commits to

being faithful to God and to His Kingdom in the gift of oneself. Couples commit through marriage to be faithful to one another in the gift of oneself in mutual fidelity.

Consequently, on February 2^{nd} , I invite all of us to take the time to meditate upon our consecration as members of a secular institute and upon the evangelical counsels that animate each one of us according to our particular modality of commitment.

All is Possible to God

Dear Friends,

This month of March is entirely inhabited with Lent that begins on the first day of the month. We will be living this Lent with our Blessed Mother, the Virgin of the Annunciation whose feast day, also our Patronal Feast day, we will celebrate on March 25th. At the moment of Mary's *fiat*, Christ becomes corporally present in her own body. Thus, He says to His Father: «Here I am, I come . . . to do your will» (Ps. 39). This double *fiat* starts after the angel reassures Mary by telling her that **nothing is impossible for God** (Luke 1: 37).

Here is how I connect these words of the angel with our own Lenten commitment. I invite us at first to enter into ourselves . . . to make this reflection by placing ourselves in the presence of God with what we are today. Also, I share with you my own personal experience and in this way I involve myself in this exhortation.

I do not know about you, but for me, unfortunately, the time of Lent is not always undertaken with the depth and seriousness that it is due. If I go back 31 years before being a part of the Institute, at the time that I lived Lent with my family, we were diligent in prayer and in daily Mass no matter our priorities of work or studies. Also, each day, we offered small sacrifices of charity by abstaining from sweets or food and then placing its monetary value in a box. On Easter day, the content of this box were then given to the priest of the parish to be distributed to the poor.

I notice that I have relaxed somewhat my practice in this regard by justifying myself in this way : as a Voluntas Dei I already give every day, I am already doing my daily prayers, I celebrate the Mass each morning, etc. Thus, I am already doing enough. The question I am posing to myself at this time: «Is it possible to do more during Lent? » The angel responded to Mary: «Nothing is impossible to God» (Luke 1: 37). On this, Father Parent added: «Anything is possible, *if you try.* » In other words, if I take a step more for God, He will support me in making two even three more. Thus, we must *try* to do more than what we do ordinarily, and God will support our effort in order for us to produce more. What seems to me impossible to achieve from the beginning becomes, thereby, possible with a little effort and patience on my part. It is in this way that I understand the seriousness of my commitment and feel called to do more during the Lent period.

What made Mary believe that all is possible to God? She first asked a question to the angel: «How is this going to happen? » If she hadn't asked this question, she would not have had the response from the angel that all is possible to God. She, therefore, *tried* to better understand by posing a first action, i.e. asking the question. This first action brought her further along in her journey. I say this because, sometimes, we abstain from asking questions or making actions out of fear or pride even though these could help us to move forward.

In this way, dear friends, let us thus begin Lent and celebrate also the feast of the *fiat* of the Virgin of the Annunciation, by taking a first step in our decision to do MORE for the Lord and let's allow Him to work within ourselves in order that we may produce more acts of charity (3rd-5) by being true witnesses of Christ and true sons and daughters of Mary.

To give and To Receive: The Transformation of Easter



This year, Easter will be celebrated during the mid-part of April, and the Easter Triduum will occur from April 13-16. The first half of the month will then consist in an intensive preparation for Easter. Therefore, we have arrived at the last sprint, at the last part of Lent, and even if, perhaps, we feel a bit out of breath by our daily efforts, we continue to live the present moment and our charity with greater depth according to the very features of Lent that are prayer, fasting and penance (almsgiving.)

So that, when the feast of Easter arrives on April 16, there will be the joy of transformation lived in faith. We will have offered to the Risen Christ our most precious

jewels. By allowing ourselves to be loved and reconciled by Him, He will increase tenfold for us the graces of a new life that will allow us to continue our journey during the second half of the month of April and even after.

I want to bring your attention to the following equation: *when we give, we receive,* but also, *when we receive, we are able to give.* With the first part of the equation, we are certainly familiar; didn't Jesus Himself evoke this principle? « Truly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands, for my sake and for the gospel, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this time, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands with persecutions, and in the age to come eternal life. » (Mark 10: 29-31) Each one of us has already felt or lived inside of us the grace, the satisfaction that brings about the gift of oneself and sharing.

As for Jesus, He gave His life, His time, His energies in order to save us. So with this gift that He has already made to us, it's just like a tap on the back to allow us to go further in the gift of ourselves, in sharing our resources.

When we arrive at the second part of the equation, *better to receive in order to give better*, there may be a little challenge. And, certainly yes! We need just to go through a test of illness or other, to understand that this step is also a part of the transformation. If I want to be able to give again, it is important in these moments of tests that I accept to receive from others the helping hand necessary so that I may be able to give again. In Christ, the test becomes an opportunity for transformation. At that time, I can take a different route like the disciples of Emmaus who, having experienced the test, accepted to receive the Risen Jesus, and could thereafter continue their life with a new breath.

As for Jesus, did He not also live the step of receiving? He who had suffered and died, also accepted at the very heart of His own test, to receive from the Father the strength of the resurrection and the Holy Spirit that He shares with us still today.

Thus, each time that we celebrate the feast of Easter, we move closer to the eternal Easter: the journey of transformation operates in us step by step, *in giving* but also *in accepting to receive*.

In summary, I invite each one of us to commit ourselves into the following process: firstly, let us think of what we want to offer Jesus on the Cross. Secondly, let us receive the grace of the paschal mystery by allowing Him to work within us to transform our lives. And finally, let us rejoice in the new life that has been given to us by Christ.

Dear friends,

As you may know, in 2017 we celebrate the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady at Fatima, Portugal; she appeared to three young shepherds, Lucia (10 years old), Francesco (9) and Jacinta (7). These apparitions of Our Lady went on from May 13th to October 13th of 1917 and were preceded, from 1915 to 1916, by the apparitions of the Angel of Portugal to the same children as a preparation to our Lady's visits. Just to remind you, 1917 marked the end of World War I.

There are three aspects I would like to underline today from these apparitions. <u>First</u>, the prayers and messages inspired from some of these apparitions insist on our dedication to the Holy Trinity, underlining the absolute unity among the three persons of same nature within the One God. <u>Second</u>, Our Lady insisted upon the daily prayer of the Holy Rosary for peace within us and in the world, as well as for peace of the souls in need of salvation. <u>Finally</u>, these messages were authenticated by the great miracle of the Dance of the Sun on October 13th 1917 when approximately 70,000 people were gathered on the Cova da Iria (place of apparitions) under pouring rain. As the Sun started waving in the sky, coming closer to the earth, the people's wet garments dried up in a fraction of a second, and their eyes were not affected by looking at the Sun.

A lot could be said concerning these apparitions. But let me expand a bit on the second element, the **daily Rosary** *to obtain peace*. Today, we also live in a context of war, of terrorism and of corruption at all levels. No need to give you examples here. The need for peace is very high: peace among nations, peace within the soul of each person, peace within the families and communities, *etc.* One cannot expect peace among nations if, first of all, each individual does not start to work genuinely at obtaining peace within oneself, and within one's own environment. A Chinese proverb goes this way: «If you want the earth to be clean, start by cleaning up your own backyard.» Working at peace is an everyday challenge for us all, and for us Voluntas Dei, it is an essential part of our mission.

So how does the daily Rosary fits into peacemaking? Our Lady presents this prayer as a very powerful tool of intercession. Making peace includes personal efforts, but most especially includes personal prayer through the Rosary, so that Mother Mary may complete and add up to whatever is missing from our limited efforts. This way she can help rebuild the Trinitarian unity and, thus, the peace among all human beings.

We, as Voluntas Dei, are like the three young shepherds of Fatima. We share with them the mission to build peace in the world through our charity, but also through our prayer, and especially through the daily Rosary.

Therefore, in this month of May, month of Mary, let us commit ourselves to a deeper and more dedicated daily Rosary, as we pray to obtain peace in the world, peace for souls in need of salvation, and peace in our lives, families and communities.

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Month of Mary

In the Church, the month of May is traditionally dedicated to Mother Mary. As Voluntas Dei, Mother Mary has a special place in our spiritual life and in our mission to build peace. Let's take this opportunity to get even closer to her and to the Trinity through the daily Rosary and other means of intercession.

How to Overcome Seven Temptations?

For the month of June, I thought I could share with you excerpts from the homily that Pope Francis delivered during his trip to Egypt at the end of April of this year. Being a good father, he left thus a spiritual legacy to the clergy and consecrated Catholics in Egypt as well as to each of us as Voluntas Dei; indeed, we are going to see together how his remarks illustrate well, among other things, our second 5.

During his homily, the Pope noted seven temptations upon which we need to focus our attention : (1) to allow oneself to get carried away instead of guiding, (2) to complain continually, (3) to gossip and to be jealous, (4) to compare oneself to others, (5) to let *pharaonism* take over, which he explained in this way : « that is to harden one's heart and to close it off from the Lord and brothers and sisters ». (6) Also the temptations that lead to individualism, and (7) to walk without compass or goal.

Let's look firstly at what he says about the *first temptation*, that «of allowing oneself to be carried away rather than guided». As Christian models, we often fulfill the role of *pastors* in our respective realms. «The good pastor has the duty to guide the flock (...) Pope tells us. «He/she cannot allow him/herself to be carried away by deception and pessimism (. ..). He/she has always a caress of consolation even if his/her heart is afflicted. He/she is a father/mother when the children treat him/her with gratitude but especially when they are not grateful. Our faithulness to the Lord should never depend upon human gratitude.» Here is a way of acting that reflects well what it means to be a *peacemaker*, the 5th point of our second 5.

In regard to the *second temptation*, the Holy Father places us on guard against the «temptation of complaining continually». Does this not remind us of the 3rd point of our second 5? *Absence of useless complaint*... Thus, the Holy Father invites us to remain under the anointing of the Holy Spirit in order that we may transform «any obstacle into opportunity and not any difficulty in excuse! » To remain under the anointing of the Holy Spirit calls us to be continually *in the presence of God*, the 1st point of our second 5.

The third temptation, represents a real challenge for whomever wants to advance in the spiritual ways: « the temptation of gossiping and jealousy. » The Holy Father does not mince his words. He claims that this temptation is « very bad, » even « dangerous » when one allows oneself to be carried away by words that wound the Body of Christ rather than building it up. In opposition to this temptation, our 2^{nd} point of the second 5, *absence of destructive criticism*, invites us to praise God for the success of our brothers and sisters rather than sabotaging their reputation and allowing some doubt to remain about them. In this way, we can build peace.

The Holy Father does not skimp on *« the temptation of comparing oneself to others. »* In acting this way, we take away of the uniqueness and originality of each person. *«* To compare ourselves to those who are better than us makes us fall often into resentment; to compare ourselves to those who are worse than us makes us fall often into pride and laziness. *»* Jealousy can easily prevent the rooting of the sense of wonder. On the contrary, the Pope recommends *to serve* humbly our brothers and sisters in praising God for *«* the diversity of characters, charisms and opinions *»*, as well as *«* to listen to the Holy Spirit *»*. We touch here upon the 4th point of our second 5, *being of service*.

Regarding the *fifth temptation*, the Pope makes the connection between a historical and biblical reality that occurred in Egypt, but which we can all live at different times in our existence: he calls *pharaonism* the temptation that hardens the heart and closes it off from the Lord and brothers and sisters. «It is the temptation to feel above others and therefore to submit them by vain glory: it is to have the presumption to be served rather than to serve.» In order to counteract this temptation, our spirituality invites us *to serve* others humbly while being *in the presence of God*.

«The temptation of individualism, *in sixth place*, is a follow-up to *pharaonism* explained above. «It is the temptation of egoistic people who, while journeying, are losing track of their goal, and who, instead of thinking of others, think only of themselves without feeling any shame about it, on the contrary, by justifying it.» Here, our *third 5* can act as a preventative medicine: our acts of charity granted and accepted in daily life redress in us selfish tendencies.

Finally, here is the *seventh*, «the temptation to walk without compass or goal. The consecrated person (. . .) lives a shared heart between God and worldliness. He/she forgets his/her first love. We are consecrated persons; we live for the Lord since the Lord gave His life for us. Let us offer Him the whole of ourselves each day.

What is interesting is that the Pope also gave us the remedy to help us not to yield to these temptations. « It is not easy to resist these temptations unless we remain grafted to Jesus : 'Remain in Me as I am in you. Likewise, the vine shoot cannot bear fruit by itself unless it remains *grafted* to the vine, and neither can you unless you remain grafted to Me.'»

«The quality of our consecration depends on the quality of our spiritual life.» We have just seen that for us as members of the Voluntas Dei Institute, this means living deeply our 5-5-5 spirituality.

Dear friends, let us take advantage of this month of Pentecost to ask the Holy Spirit to clothe us with courage, strength and renewed fervor in the Risen Christ. *Come Holy Spirit!*
