Dear friends,

The month of July reminds us of our foundation that occurred precisely on July 2nd, 1958. This year especially, as you all know, we celebrate, on this very date, the 60th anniversary of our foundation. Our Institute is *secular* which means it is having a very special relationship with today's world. Our consecration and mission are meant to be lived in the midst of the world and adjusted with the signs of time. So, my dear friends, let us evaluate from the essence of our secular consecration how our spirit of brotherhood works within our team life, and how we do live our vows and commitments accordingly to our specific charism.

Jesus was *incarnated* into our world making himself part of his own Creation, as well as of our human history. He came among us in order to elevate the whole Creation and humanity into God's Kingdom. He came to heal the whole being of each person, and not for political reasons. As members of the Voluntas Dei Institute, this is what we are also called to live and experience: an incarnated consecration in the midst of today's world, that is, the synthesis of both the secularity and the consecration as inspired by the incarnation mystery of Jesus himself in this world. This way of relating to the world inspires us to dedicate ourselves to the people, helping them to recognize God, in his Creation, in the events of human history, in his people, and especially in their hearts. From this secular consecration emerges a continual dialogue between the contemplation of God and the realities of the world. The mission emerges from this dialogue where one contemplates the mystery of Incarnation and proposes to the others to recognize and live this same mystery within their own lives.

The mission in the IVDei is lived within a fraternal frame which does not necessarily evolve from a common life like for religious communities, but rather from a *team* of which members meet together on a regular basis. It is the setting where we are invited to build peace and brotherhood in Jesus-Christ. This team life has to be discerned and reinforced in each member's vocation and formation; it also has to be facilitated in a way where each team member feels responsible for his/own team as well as for his/her own vocation. The team is the opportunity where diversity and unity meet: as we say so well in our Institute, "unity in diversity", and, "diversity in unity". The team is the setting that facilitates discernment in the different aspects of our engagement, and that reinforces service and altruism as opposed to self-centeredness.

Sixty years ago, Father Parent discerned this possibility for a deep brotherhood within a team life setting, and accordingly to this, he formulated a beautiful charism for our Institute. Therefore, according to this specific charism of ours, we are called to live our evangelical counsels in one of these three manners: 1) *vows* (for consecrated members), 2) *commitments* (for married couples), and 3) *promises* (for affiliated persons). The consecration in the IVDei is lived in the secularity of daily life with the challenges and realities of the world, but also simultaneously inspired by the values of the Gospel.

We all need to take time personally to review our own commitment in this light, as we are taking the 60^{th} year of our foundation. On this occasion, I wish you all the best, and bless you all, asking God to deepen and to bring to maturity, for each of us, the sense of belongingness to the Institute, according to His own Will and plan.

"To Evangelize" means what for a Voluntas Deí?

Dear friends,

We are at the beginning of our 60th year and anniversary of foundation. The Lord invites us both to give thanks and to renew our mission as individuals and as an Institute. With these few lines, I will try to sketch out some ways to help us better understand what it means to "evangelize" for a Voluntas Dei. St. Paul said: "Woe to me if I do not evangelize! (1 Corinthians 9:16) But what exactly does the word "evangelize" mean in the context of our Institute?

One could easily think that to evangelize consists first of all in preaching as Paul and others did. And that's very true! But we also know that not everyone is able to preach. The same St. Paul speaks indeed of the diversity of charisms and, consequently, evangelization can take place according to the charisms that each one has. I would like to propose a simple way that I believe to be within the reach of each one of us.

Recently, I asked myself the question: "When was the last time I brought someone to Jesus? ... have I been able these days to accompany someone to Jesus as a priest and more precisely as Voluntas Dei?" And just after this questioning, members of my own family came to me in person that I may accompany them to Jesus. What I did was to simply try to be more attentive to their needs. We sometimes forget that evangelizing is more often within our reach than we think: an event, a meeting, the death or illness of someone, all these situations can constitute opportunities to evangelize, more specifically to accompany people to Jesus.

When I'm accompanying someone, I'm not always talking to him/her or teaching morals. When I accompany a person, firstly, I am attentive to his/her needs, to his/her difficulty; I start by listening to him/her. Then, afterwards, I can insert a simple word of encouragement, or support, and above all, I can invite the person to trust in Christ in the situation that he or she is concerned with. I can also go a step further, if the context lends itself, and I can pray with the person by offering him or her to Jesus for peace and surrender. And afterwards, I let the Holy Spirit act ... Let's never forget that if, humanly, we can support the situation materially speaking, we have a responsibility to do so. Did not Jesus say, "Whoever gives only one glass of cold water to one of these little ones because he is my disciple, truly I say to you, he will not lose his reward. "(Mt 10:42). Therefore, we have the responsibility to accompany human beings materially speaking, as well as spiritually towards Christ.

Dear friends, you may find that I am not describing great pastoral programs that claim to lead to evangelization. I am describing us as evangelizers in the day to day situations; this is where we work as members of a secular institute. So, let's take advantage of the simple opportunities available to us to make a difference, that is to say, not only to encourage people humanly or psychologically speaking, but also,

if their hearts are open, to talk to them about what Jesus did in our own lives, so that by witnessing of his presence and his action, we can arouse in them hope and confidence.

Dear Friends,

As you know, the month of October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. As devotion to the Blessed Virgin was very dear to Father Parent, I feel inspired in this letter to share with you a historical fact that concerns Sri Lanka, Father Parent and the Blessed Virgin Mary. This helps to keep alive and present to our collective memory some features of the history of our Institute.

In 1975, Father Parent personally visited Sri Lanka for the fourth and last time. In that same year, there was a drought in the whole country and Father Parent decided to use this sign to allow him to discern the Lord's will concerning the permanent foundation of the Institute in Sri Lanka. He simply prayed for the rain to fall on the country. The rain came down three times: it began to rain then it stopped; it started up then it stopped a second time; then, again, a third time. With this special sign, Father Parent grasped that God's will was to found the Institute permanently in Sri Lanka. He then placed the foundation stone of formation house in the village of Muhamalai not too far from a small shrine dedicated to the Virgin Mary under the patronage of Our Lady of Good Health. The Voluntas Dei then became at that time the guardians of this sanctuary.

In 2000, the village of Muhamalai was the center of an ethnic war resulting in several hundred deaths, as well as the destruction by bombing of numerous buildings including the small sanctuary of Our Lady of Good Health and the house of formation that Father Parent had erected. For having narrowly escaped a bombing myself, one can feel again and experience all the anxiety of this tragic war and its consequences.

I then thought of sharing my experience with Father Parent and the then Director General, Father François Hamel IVDei. Father Parent remembered the small shrine, and the little statue of Our Lady of Good Health, as well as the sign that he had once asked to the Lord concerning the foundation of the Institute in Sri Lanka in 1975. He then asked François and I to go to Muhamalai to retrieve the statue of Our Lady of Good Health from the rubble and to bring it back to Canada where it would be safe.

In 2004, Father François Hamel and I left for Muhamalai, still declared a war zone. After having encountered several difficulties, we arrived at the location of the small shrine, place which had been bombed. Fortunately, we found the statue which had remained intact, without any damage, and we brought it back to Canada. When Father Parent saw the statue, he was filled with joy. He exclaimed, « Let's keep this statue here to make us think of praying the Virgin Mary to obtain peace in Sri Lanka. » Thus, every day he prayed intensely for peace in Sri Lanka. Even toward the end of his life, when he began to have small memory loss, he always asked us, « Has peace returned to Sri Lanka? » That he did not forget; it was a great preoccupation for him.

I was in India when the morning of May 18, 2009, I received the phone call from the Central House about the news of the death of our dear Father Parent. In Canada, it was the evening of May 17th. Shortly thereafter, I received another great news, that of the ceasing fire in Sri Lanka: the war was over. This concordance of events is not random for me; it shows us how close Father Parent was to the Virgin Mary and the will of God. The small statue of Our Lady of Good Health is now here at the Central House in Trois-Rivieres; she reminds us every day of the closeness that Father Parent had with the Virgin Mary in order to find, thanks to her, the path to the will of God.

As we are in October, I invite you all to pray to the Virgin Mary, our Mother, as Father Parent did with so much ardor, to better discern in our turn the will of God in our lives.

To Be Holy

Dear Friends.

With this month of November beginning with All Saints' Day, I would like to speak to you about a theme dear to Father Parent, that of *being holy!* Father Parent had always this idea in his head throughout his projects, foundations and spiritual meetings both, on a one-to-one basis and in groups. *To be holy* was for him the existential goal to be sought, the objective to be attained in a life of relationship with God and others. All of his spirituality of the 5-5-5 gravitated around the objective of holiness. You will say to me perhaps: « Was not his objective that of peace, fellowship and charity? » Certainly! But, undoubtedly you will agree with me that peace, fellowship and charity in Jesus, the Christ, more than being personal objectives, are they not also the means to arrive at holiness? It seems to me that one does not go without the other, that holiness and fellowship go together hand in hand.

All the Christian spiritualities that have emerged since the coming of Christ have as their aim to bring people to holiness, whether it be the Carmelite spirituality, the Franciscan spirituality, the Dominican, the Benedictine, or the Ignatian spiritualities, *etc*. Each in its own way contributes to the shaping of the heart of man and woman for the purpose of transforming them into Christ.

Our spirituality of the 5-5-5 has also the same role that of bringing us to holiness, that of transforming us into Christ. It does it in its unique way, practical, simple and embedded in daily life especially lived in the midst of the world. It constitutes an effective way of bringing us to Christ and transforming us into Him, with Him and through Him through the five attitudes of life, through the privileged moments of prayer and through the five (or more) acts of charity or kindness toward others.

The team is the privileged place where our spirituality of the 5-5-5 is lived. As Father Parent said so very well, the team constitutes the laboratory *par excellence* where we can experience and multiply the attitudes of life, the various forms of prayer and acts of charity and fellowship that concretize our desire to become holy in Jesus Christ.

I draw your attention to the role that the *review of the day* can play (otherwise known as the daily examination of conscience) in the fact of becoming holy. If at the end of each day, we take the time to well examine how we have lived the day in the light of Christ, of His Gospel, of our 5-5-5 spirituality, as well as of our objective to create peace and fellowship in Jesus Christ, our tomorrow will be much holier than our today and yesterday; our future will become clearer through Christ and His grace; our present moment will be lived more in the presence of God, and our past—even wounded—will be overflowing with the mercy of the Father.

A simple question emerges at the time of making this review of the day: « How did I consider the events of this day? Did I perceive them and react to them in a positive or negative way? » The reply made in all honesty before the Lord will help us to straighten out, to reorient ourselves, and to make adjustments.

To be holy, is a daily long-term job. It is a work upon oneself that demands honesty, insight and faithfulness toward God, toward others and oneself. It is a long-term investment that focuses on fellowship, on service, on unconditional welcome of the other, and on peace. It is a constant seeking in the present moment of the positive that arises in all aspects of our lives.

Dear friends, in closing, let us be in thanksgiving and gratitude for all that God has given us of knowledge and understanding concerning daily holiness *via* Father Parent, our holy Founder and especially through his spirituality of the 5-5-5.

To Forgive in the Faith

Dear friends.

We are approaching Christmas and New Year. In this time of rebirth, we all wish to rejoice and enjoy this holiday season with family and friends. Unfortunately, we often experience unresolved feelings of resentment towards certain people, which prevents us from living the holidays in complete inner freedom and truly at peace with each other.

Recently, I was meditating the readings of Mass and I told myself that it takes a lot of faith to forgive as Jesus wants us to forgive. Looking more closely at Paul's letter to Titus (1: 1-9), I identified fifteen qualities that Paul gave to Titus as criteria for choosing his future community leaders. These same qualities can serve us when we are forgiving someone. Here they are: to be without reproach, without arrogance, without anger, not to be drunk, not to be brutal, not to be greedy for money, to be welcoming, to be a good friend, to be reasonable, to be just, to be holy, to be in self-control, to be attached to the Word, to be worthy of faith and to conform to sound doctrine, and, finally, to be able to exhort with sound teaching.

Dear friends, if we pass the test of these fifteen qualities, I assure you that we are on the right path to be able to forgive the way Christ wants it. In addition, the Gospel of Luke 17 (1-6) challenges us to forgive relentlessly those who repent of their faults. On this, the disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith in order to achieve such availability in forgiveness. Jesus replies that they just need to have as big as a grain of mustard of faith to get there. Let's look at our inner disposition: do we have faith as big as a mustard seed? If so, we have the inner disposition which is essential to be able to forgive in faith and in the Holy Spirit those who have offended us.

In short, it is important for us to ask for the grace of faith and charity to be able to forgive as Jesus wants. When we pray to God, we must also be sure that we are going to get what we ask for! Let's start by asking for small things: "Lord deliver me from my headache, my anger, etc.", but, let's be sure to get it! "Lord, I ask you, thanking you in advance for answering my prayer." That's what Jesus did at Lazarus' resurrection, and that was a big thing to ask! He said, "Father, I give you thanks because you have answered me. I knew it well, me, that you always answer me." Was his prayer answered? Yes! Lazarus came out alive from his tomb.

My dear friends, I wish that all of us may practice our forgiveness in this faith manner: always ask for the grace of faith by thanking in advance that we are getting it. Let's take a moment of silence to make a first practice: go down deep inside of ourselves to see if there is anyone to whom we owe a pardon ... Now let's say in faith this prayer of forgiveness:

Most Holy Father, in the name of your Son Jesus, by the grace of his Holy Spirit, I forgive ... (name the person in our heart) all the harm that person did to me. I ask you Father, to bless him/her, to heal him/her, to release him/her, to draw him/her to you by Jesus Christ your Son. And I ask you to free me from all my grudges. Amen.

Now we are ready to live our holiday season in peace, and to welcome Jesus into our hearts at Christmas.

The Challenge of Fidelity

Dear Friends,

We are beginning a new year and, as always, we want it to be better than the year before. Even in improving ourselves, we also want to be a better person than in the past, and for that to happen, we very often take resolutions that we apply as best as we can. We are called to be faithful to God, but, unfortunately, our human condition brings us too often elsewhere. And it is then that we become distant from God, fearing to remain in His presence. We do not always do this consciously, but it is often what happens, like Adam in the Garden of Eden; after his fall, he hides himself so that God does not see that he is naked.

But God calls him anyways: « Adam, Adam, where are you? » God calls us also despite our failures: « Jim, Michael, Bob, Alicia . . . (put your name in), where are you? » And we have difficulty facing God on account of our infidelities. Even, we sometimes say like Adam: « It is not I who did it, but the woman you gave me. » And the woman replies, « It is not I but the serpent. » In this way, we hold others hostage to justify our own failures. « It is not my fault. It is because of so and so, or yet, it is on account of such and such circumstance or event. »

Thus, we are called not only to be faithful to God, but even more, to be true and honest with ourselves, and with others. Truth and humility go hand in hand; if I am honest regarding my failure, if I acknowledge my fault without trying to justify myself, then I adopt an attitude of humility that pleases God and that propels me forward. Also, I leave it to others the responsibility of acknowledging their own failures without judging them.

God left Adam and Eve the freedom to eat from all the trees in the garden, except for one tree, that of the knowledge of good and evil. And it is in this ban that the serpent worms himself in to make believable the opposite and to render the fruit attractive. So, it is for us: God let's us lead our life freely, except for the evangelical counsels that He asks us to hold and to keep whole in the light of our commitment. It should not surprise us that it will be through this way that the crafty little devil will worm himself in to tempt us regarding poverty, chastity and obedience. But always what saves us is our attitude of wisdom and humility in the truth.

Dear friends, as we begin the year 2019, let us take the time to thank God for all the graces of conversion and return to Him that He has granted us in the past, and for all these occasions where humility and truth have prevailed over denial and lies. Let's take the time also to evaluate ourselves in our way of living the evangelical counsels and, in general, in our attitude regarding the call that the Lord addresses to us as Voluntas Dei. Do we have humble and true hearts before

the Lord? Or do we constantly justify ourselves to our mistakes? God loves us and does not condemn us. Let us go to Him with confidence!

Dear friends, let us ask the Lord that the testimony of our responsibility be true in the eyes of people around us; that our language be kind and positive, and that our vision of life be full of hope in spite of the hardships we have to face. In this way, we will actively and

effectively contribute not only to the expansion of our institute, but also to the progress of the Church, and especially to the coming of the Reign of God and to the fulfillment of the Father's will, on earth as in heaven.

How Far Will You Follow Me?

Dear Friends,

Last month we saw how the witness of our responsibility must be authentic in the eyes of the people around us. We have understood that radicality in favour of the good and charity is imperative in our behaviour and choices more than ever, and that this cannot hold without a dose of wisdom and discernment.

This month, in addition to celebrating the Annunciation, our feast day, we are entering the Lenten season, more precisely starting on March 6th with *Ash Wednesday*, to prepare ourselves for Easter. This will be for us another opportunity to formulate and put into practice new resolutions in our faith journey. The theme that the magazine, *Vie liturgique* (*Liturgical Life*) proposes to us is as follows: *How far will you follow me*? This theme throws us a personal challenge: are we ready to go to the end of ourselves to follow Christ? We can turn to Mary, full of grace, to receive the graces of perseverance necessary to examine our lives in the light of the Gospel, and to bring to our commitment a new and sustained fervour.

We live in times of persecution and misunderstanding. The Church is strongly shaken at its base by scandals of all kinds. Our Pope Francis has put his hand to the plow to uproot the evil and bring to life the good. We sense that he is ready to go *to the end of* himself to straighten up the Church. We too, are called to go further. We are called to weed our personal spiritual garden and to pull out the couch grass that prevents the good shoots from coming to the surface. The Chinese proverb says: "If you clean your yard well, the whole city will become clean." The time of Lent is a time of purification, of reorganization of our inner life which reflects itself also in our external behaviour. It is a moment to make adjustment, to reconcile, to accept what we cannot change, but also to discern what we can, and what we need to change.

This is not about withdrawing into oneself, but rather of entering into oneself to better go out towards the others and to help change unfortunate situations of life. Perhaps, like the Virgin of the Annunciation, we ask ourselves: « How is this going to happen? » The angel reminds her that for God nothing is impossible. Are we involved in delicate situations? Do we want to help someone get out of the doldrums? Do we wish to straighten up our lives so that it is truly aligned with holiness? Let us remember that nothing is impossible for God. In the manner of Father Parent, let us cultivate a spirit of humility strongly animated by a spirit of faith and charity through the challenges that life offers us. Instead of allowing ourselves to be crushed by these challenges or difficulties, let us nourish ourselves with the trust of Mary in order to bounce back stronger.

Dear friends, let us ask the Lord for the grace not to withdraw into ourselves, nor to run away from the challenges before us. Let's be people of service, peacemakers, builders of fraternity with

our eyes fixed on Christ Who gives us all graces. Our Institute and the entire Church will only be better served.

To Pass Over

Dear Friends,

In a few days we will arrive at *the Paschal Feast (Easter)*; this word comes from the Hebrew word *pessah* which literally means « to pass over. » If we remember the epic story of the exit from Egypt in Exodus, chapter 12 to chapter 15, we see how the Lord *passed* through Egypt with various plagues, more especially with the final scourge of the death of the firstborn of the Egyptians. Among others, the angel of death *passed over* the houses marked with the blood of the pascal lamb; in other words, death did not enter in these houses to extinguish the firstborn of the Hebrews. It *passed over*. Also, at the time of the crossing of the Red Sea and of the desert later on, the Lord *passed before* or *ahead* of the people in a column of fire at night, and in a cloud during the day to guide and fortify them during this crossover. Thus, the Lord *passes before us* or *ahead of us* all along our lives if we believe so, and if we are attentive to it.

In our turn, with Him as guide, the Lord invites us *to pass through* our trials and challenges of life with His strength and grace. He does not allow us to cross alone; he is present with us as He once was with the people of Israel. Also, He invites us most often *to pass over* the pettiness of others, over insults, or any other disagreeable situation in which we find ourselves. That does not mean that it is inappropriate for us to seek dialogue, or even, to express our feeling. But, on the end, it is more a matter of *passing over*, that is, of moving beyond, by forgiving and accepting with the grace of resilience that accompanies us. All of this is quite adjusted to us as "peacemakers" through our vocation and spirituality.

The Lord invites us to be the « traversing » people like the « Hebrews » whose Hebraic root *ivrim* means « traversing » or « going across ». He wants to propel us beyond difficulties; He invites us to « traverse » them with faith. He does not want us to remain in the darkness or in sin. He reminds us that the resurrection goes far beyond death and the tomb. He wants us to walk in the new life that is destined for us, accepting the sanctification which is a part of it. It is with an attitude of faith that we will be able to go beyond, to cross over, to propel ourselves further, and higher than our simple human life, whatever our conditions of life, miseries or poverty. Only faith will allow us to advance in a new life through reconciliation, and accepting to feel uninstalled, as well as accepting ourselves as we are.

Easter thus encompasses this reality of *passing over*, of *going beyond* whatever overwhelms us on this earth, in order to reach the spiritual dimension of our being, and it is firstly within ourselves that can be realized this transformation.

Dear Friends,

Let's Put the Holy Spirit in There!

Dear Friends,

For everything that we live, it is important to put the Holy Spirit in there; be it at work, in leisure activities, about health issues, in our decisions, our relationships, our attitudes, without forgetting our prayer-life. The Holy Spirit has his place everywhere and he wishes to get involved with everything we do and in all that we are! He has the right to "mind our own business"! Allowing him to act in all the areas of our life can make a huge difference in the expected results.

As you know, the feast of Pentecost will take place on June 9th. This celebration not only highlights the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and disciples of Jesus, but also reminds us of the birth of the Church. The event of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the young community of believers was, indeed, the starting point of the Church of Christ on earth. Before the coming of the Holy Spirit, the apostles and the disciples were overwhelmed by fear. They enclosed themselves not only behind the locked doors of their homes, but they also locked themselves psychologically within themselves by taking no risk in faith. As soon as they had experienced the Holy Spirit, everything changed in them: from fear they passed to confidence, from insecurity they passed to boldness. Their life was transformed.

It should be so for us too! With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we should move from a negative to a positive spirit; move from criticism to wonder; from complaint to praise; from tepidity to fervour; from apathy to enthusiasm; from self-centredness to being of service; from animosity to peace. In summary, with the grace of the Holy Spirit in us, we should be able to deepen our spirituality of the 5-5-5 and proclaim the Good News of salvation through the witness of our personal transformation.

We have just put our finger on the particular Pentecost that Father Parent lived and transmitted to us through this enthusiasm for the 5-5-5. Each spirituality given to the Church throughout the centuries has been, and continues to be, with its own specificity, a renewal grace of Pentecost. Our 5-5-5 spirituality is, indeed, a unique opportunity to allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives and to give him all the space He needs.

If we look at the story of the construction of the tower of Babel in Genesis, we notice that the builders acted in their own name and especially for their own misplaced vanity. At the beginning of the project, all spoke the same language and understood each other. But as the construction progressed, their language became confused and they no longer understood each other. Result? They ended up being divided among themselves, dispersed and so, they had to interrupt building the tower.

At Pentecost, on the other hand, the apostles expressed themselves in various tongues from the beginning; then, the more they allowed themselves to be taken by the Holy Spirit, the more this linguistic diversity gave way to the unity of hearts. This is also our goal, for all of us, Father Parent's spiritual daughters and sons. We come from diverse countries, languages and cultures, but we are all united by the same Holy Spirit, by the same desire to work in unity, to create peace and fellowship in Jesus Christ. This is our apostolic objective! Is this not emerging from Pentecost, or, if you wish, from the coming of the Holy Spirit into our lives?

In closing, I wish that we all open our hearts to the Holy Spirit, that we let ourselves be touched by this Spirit of the living God to be able to work together, more and more, better and better, to create peace and fraternity in Jesus Christ.
