I am pleased to communicate with you through the letter of the month of July 2021. As always, remembering with immense gratitude and appreciation your unconditional support in our special needs.

On this occasion, I would like to present to you our request for financial assistance for the upkeep of our Formation House for the Major Seminarians in Ampitiya, Kandy (Kandy Diocese). At present, ten major seminarians are receiving their formation under the guidance of two priests and three more candidates are awaiting to enter our house.

The Formation House for the Major Seminarians is located in a hilly area and during the rainy season, landslides occur. Maintenance has been done according to our ability. At present, we feel the urgency of building a solid retaining wall close to the main gate to prevent mud and water from the mountains to the premise.

The estimated cost for the construction of the retaining wall is 2,500.00\$ CAD.

We continue to be united in prayer and thank you once again for your continued support.
